23 overdose deaths in a population of less than 18,000

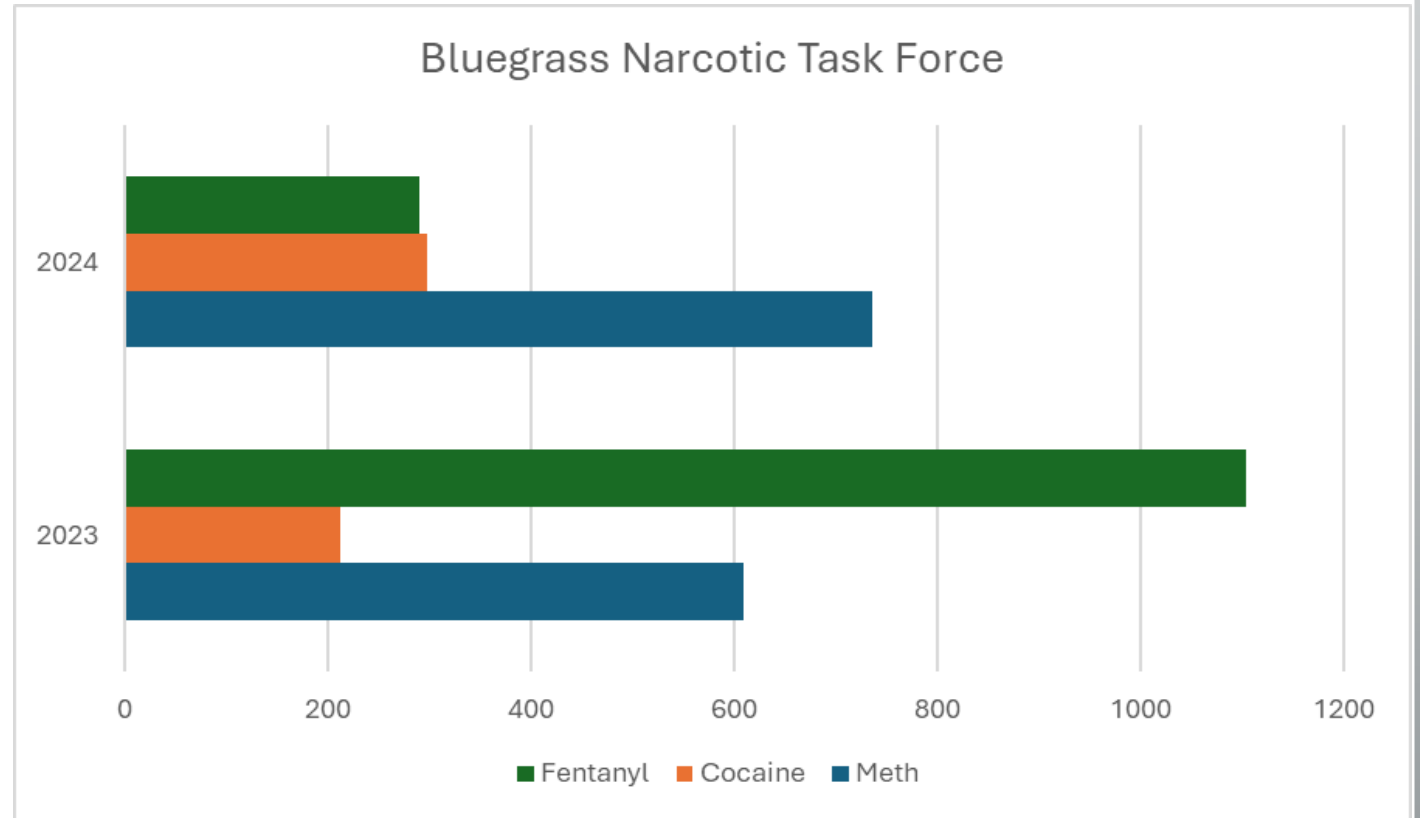
Over 500 drug-related calls for service

Ranked among the highest in Kentucky for overdose deaths per capita

3rd-highest rate of overdose-related ER visits statewide

Bluegrass Narcotic Task Force

- In 2024 alone, BNTF seized enough fentanyl and fentanyl laced pills, enough to cause more than 124,000 deaths.



Measurable Impact Harrison County

There has been an 80 percent reduction in the number of drug enforcement complaints.

The number of drug-related calls for service has decreased to 94 in 2024, down from 500 in 2016.

The number of overdose deaths has dropped to 1 in 2024 from 23 in 2016 (in Harrison County), which is a **95 percent decrease** in fatalities.

Measurable Impact Bourbon County

More than a 50 percent reduction in drug-related enforcement demand related to drug overdoses/deaths

Overdose deaths reduced to 7 from 18 in early 2020s a year (Bourbon County) represents a 60% decline in fatalities
