


Honoring Service, Healing Justice

Why Treatment Courts?

- Intervene on the "Revolving Door" of criminal activity
- Mandated treatment with strict compliance and expectations
- Treatment and Justice hand-in-hand
- "Motivated" Court Defendant = "Thirsty" treatment client

Drug Court

- Participants have been diagnosed with Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
 - Abuse of illicit or prescription drugs, and/or alcohol
- Focus on ensuring stability and sobriety across four key dimensions of recovery: health, home, purpose and community

Mental Health Court

- Participants have been diagnosed with behavioral health conditions, which may include mental illness, substance use disorder, and/or intellectual disabilities
 - Ex: Bipolar Disorder, Schizophrenia, Major Depressive Disorder
- Mental illness is primary factor in justice-involvement
- Focus on promoting stability through consistent monitoring of medication adherence

Veterans Treatment Court

- Participants have been diagnosed with behavioral health conditions, which may include mental illness, substance use disorder, or a co-occurring disorders
 - Ex: Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) or Traumatic Brian Injury (TBI)
- Focus on promoting stability through consistent monitoring of medication adherence and an emphasis on veteran peer mentoring

Who We Serve



- Veterans and active-duty service members
- Veterans with behavioral health challenges
- Often justice-involved due to trauma

Cost Comparison




Average annual cost per incarcerated person in Kentucky is \$16,060 (approximately \$44 per day).




Annual Specialty Court participant cost is \$6,507.85 (approximately \$18 per day).


Statewide VTC Referrals/Entrances




Hardin Co VTC Referrals/Entrances

Statewide VTC Outcomes

113	participants obtained employment	84%	of VTC graduates remained free of new Felony or Misdemeanor Convictions within 3 years (147)
67	participants completed in-patient treatment	76K+	76,363 recovery support meetings attended by participants
175	participants successfully completed the program (2016 – 2021)	\$242K+	Paid on obligations by participants

Hardin Co VTC Outcomes

19	participants obtained employment	97%	remained free of new Felony or Misdemeanor Convictions within 3 years (34)
18	participants completed in-patient treatment	17K+	17,194 recovery support meetings attended by participants
35	participants successfully completed the program (2016 – 2021)	\$70K+	Paid on obligations by participants

Statewide Recidivism

Time After Completion	Re-Arrest	Re-Incarceration
≤ 6 months	2.86% (5)	0.57% (1)
1 year	7.43% (13)	1.14% (2)
3 years	20.57% (36)	4.57% (8)

Kentucky's general recidivism rate: 30.81% (two-year measure)
