# Task Force

- A task force workgroup first met in March to look into what steps can be taken in light of events.
- It was decided to deliver awareness courses around the state for emergency responders.
- Recommendation that a hands-on, tactical course be developed and delivered to build-on concepts discussed in the awareness program.

# Training Courses

- Most fire service training is based on National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standards.
- Current Awareness Level Active Shooter/Hostile Events course offering was developed in 2017 was based on several NFPA standards and other best practices.

# Statewide Awareness Level Training

- Summary of the Course Objectives:
  - Introduce Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) principles and practices.
  - Pre-incident planning and recommendations for standard operating procedures.
  - Describe best response practices.
  - Tactical Emergency Casualty Care skills.
  - Lifting techniques for casualty evacuation.

# NFPA 3000

- To address the urgent public safety needs, NFPA 3000, Standard for an Active Shooter/Hostile Events Program was issued on May 1, 2018.
- NFPA 3000 builds on information contained in other standards as well as concepts from the National Incident Management System (NIMS).

# NFPA 3000

- New training programs and curriculum will be developed around this standard.
- How this standard is ultimately applied is up to each local jurisdiction.
- The need for multiple agencies cooperatively working together in an unified command setting is a major concept of this standard.

# The Path Forward...

- The task force will continue to meet as necessary and recommend updates.
- State Fire Rescue Training will continue to deliver classes around the state to engage emergency responders on this topic.
