OVERVIEW

- Hopkinsville Electric System Provides Essential Services: Electricity and Telecommunications to City of Hopkinsville and surrounding communities
- Total Negative Financial Impact of Moratorium \$660K
- Reduced to \$105K with Payment Plans/Assistance
- Loss of Late Penalty Fees
- Overall, City Owned Electric Systems have seen a decrease in Commercial Business sales
- Customers Still in Need of Assistance in Paying Utility Bills
- \$152 Million is still available in state programs unused

<u>Lingering Effects of COVID for Municipal</u> <u>Utility Systems</u>

Significant slow down on supply shipments – Weeks to Months

- High voltage equipment (especially transformers) that used to take weeks now takes 6-9 months in some cases.
- Bucket Trucks out of service due to computer chip and parts availability
- Pipes, electrical equipment, parts and supplies.

Employees Absences:

- Sick and Vacation leave are utilized: Increased likelihood of working sick.
- Sick, Exposed or Quarantined 14 days
- Leave Assistance needed

Man Power Shortage

- Difficulty in Hiring Qualified People
- HES Actively Recruits New Hires

Kentucky's Municipal Water and Wastewater Systems

Supply Chain Disruptions Result in Slowdown of Capital Projects – PVC Pipes, etc.
 (National Issue)

Employees Absences:

 Additional Leave Assistance needed in the Short Term (State Issue – Request Short Term Leave Benefits similar to the federal program)

Man Power Shortage

• Difficulty in Hiring Qualified People at Contractor Level and at Utility Level (State Issue - Requests Incentives for Municipal Utility Hires)
