



LAND RECORDS UPDATE SEPTEMBER 26, 2023



# Snapshot of Survey

- 101 Survey Participants
- Almost 85% of County Clerks Responded
- 68% of County Clerks have 1-2 full time recording deputies
- 94 of 101 County Clerks participating have less than 5 full time recording deputies



### 2021 Task Force and the Laws Adopted


- ❖ January 1, 2024: All County Clerks shall and maintain the portal that allows a person to electronically file any recorded instrument
- ❖ June 30, 2024 each county clerk shall provide and maintain a portal that contains the recorded instruments filed on or after June 30, 1994
  - Child Support Liens: Filed on or after June 30, 2024
  - ❖ Judgment Liens, Recoupment and Unemployment Liens, Lis Pendens notices: Filed on or after June 30, 2009
  - Federal and State Tax Liens, and Civil Penalty Liens Filed on or after June 30, 2014
  - Homeowner's association, condo liens, and bail bonds Filed on or after June 30, 2019
- ❖ June 30, 2026 each county clerk shall provide and maintain a portal that contains the recorded instruments filed on or after June 30, 1966 but before June 30, 1994

#### Required Documents for 2024 & 2026 Deadlines

- **❖** Deeds
- Mortgages
- Fixture filings under the Uniform Commercial Code
- Plats of subdivided property
- All covenants, conditions, and restrictions that relate to real property
- Easements
- Leases or memorandum of leases
- Powers of attorney
- Land contracts
- **₩**Wills
- Affidavits that affect or clarify the title to property




### Funding Sources

- **♦**\$10 Storage Fee:
  - Collected when certain documents are recorded
  - Turned over into a separate account to the Fiscal Court
  - It must be spent on land records projects, equipment, or storage
- 25 Million allocated from the last biennium
  - \*RFP process lead by the Finance Department with Clerk involvement
  - ❖RFP is currently out and closing soon
  - Expect funds to be released this fall

- Fees from office
  - Some clerks can fund back scanning, upgrade equipment, or purchasing storage with their annual fee collection
- KDLA-Local Records Grants
  - County Clerks are the only entity who funds the local records grants
  - 2022 legislation adopted that 90% of off funds allocated are to be awarded to County Clerks
  - Project Grants
  - Equipment Grants
  - Salary Grants

### KDLA Process Red Tape



- History of Applying for KDLA Grants
- Current constraints
  - ❖ Regional Representatives
  - Less Clerks Applying
- Modernization vs. Preservation
- Communication Inconsistences between the representatives and leadership at KDLA
- Several Grants receive partial funding
- Bidding Process
  - Lowest Bid is always selected
  - Lowest Bid is not always the best or even compatible with the current system in that county which leaves the Clerk with formatting and conversion issues
