Eligibility

 "Any local government office interested in improving the management and preservation of its public records" is eligible to apply (725 KAR 1:050 Section 1).

90% of funds are dedicated to county clerks.

 Current grant recipients with open projects cannot apply for a new grant until the project is officially closed.



Eligibility

- Grant funds can cover "any project which seeks to improve the management and preservation of local public records," including but not limited to:
 - Security microfilming vital records
 - Rerecording projects
 - Rerecording damaged records
 - Records originally recorded with a nonpermanent process
 - Full list of examples are available on the KDLA website.



Process for Applicants

- 1. Choose the project
- 2. Write the specifications
- Advertise the invitation for bid
- 4. Fill out application
- 5. Choose the lowest bid vendor for service provided

KDLA Award Process

 Successful awards are incumbent upon the applicant's complete, accurate and timely submission.

• With the current funding, applicants will be awarded if they complete all of the necessary requirements.



KDLA Review & Recommendation Process

- 1. Local Records Branch Manager reviews application for completeness and compliance.
- 2. Local Records Grant Review Committee scores applications and refers to the State Libraries, Archives, and Records Commission.
- 3. State Libraries, Archives, and Records Commission reviews and formally approves all of the projects that meet the requirements.
- 4. Commissioner of the Department for Libraries and Archives sends notification of approval to applicants.



Statistics

FY2022 Cycle 1

• 25 applications reviewed = 92% Approval Rate

23 awarded

• FY2022 Cycle 2

• 10 applications reviewed = 90% Approval Rate

9 awarded

FY2023 Cycle 1

• 5 applications reviewed = 100% Approval Rate

5 rewarded

FY2023 Cycle 2

• 8 applications reviewed = 100% Approval Rate

8 applications awarded

FY2024 Cycle 1

- 22 applications reviewed
- 15 applications awarded





Common Errors



- Three (3) bids for each section were not submitted.
- Invitation for Bid Proposal Attachment (IFBPA) included the upload of scanned/digitized records into the local agency's records management system, which is prohibited.
- Current forms were not used.
- Copy of bid advertisements were not included in application, etc.



Successful Applicants

- Successful applications will clearly demonstrate how the grant funds will be used to preserve or provide greater access to records in local governments.
- Criteria include the following:
 - Urgency of problem
 - Significance and age of records
 - Value as a model for size and geographical location of local government
 - Soundness of proposed methods
 - Commitment of local government resources to project, etc.
