

2024 jail classifications





County jail populations







Available to all 120 counties

- **Bed allotment:** \$10 million a year
- Medical allotment: \$792,800 a year (also referred to as restricted medical)
- Local Corrections Assistance Fund: \$4.6 million a year
- Catastrophic medical: \$851,800 a year on a reimbursement basis



Jails housing state inmates

- Per diem: \$35.34
 - Begins at sentencing for a felony offense
 - + \$2 for inmate attendance in programming that does not require instructors to complete postsecondary courses
 - + \$10 for inmate attendance in programming that requires instructors to complete postsecondary courses



Program completion and sentencing credits

\$12 million a year

When a state inmate earns sentencing credit while serving time in the county jail, DOC is required to pay at the end of confinement:

- \$1,000 for program completion that resulted in a 90-day sentencing credit
- \$600 for program completion that resulted in a 60-day sentencing credit
- \$300 for program completion that resulted in a 30-day sentencing credit





Jail Cost Analysis

July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2024

Rowan County Jail Study Department of Corrections



- In 2012, the Rowan County Fiscal Court asked the Department of Corrections to conduct a feasibility study with the looming issue of an overcrowded and aging jail reaching its end of life.
- The study returned only two options: close the then 78-bed facility and transport inmates elsewhere for detention, or build a new facility to meet the immediate needs of Rowan County.
- At the time of the study, 5 of the 7 surrounding counties had closed their jails.
- Today, 6 of the 7 surrounding counties have closed jails.
- The nearby counties with full-service facilities that were closest to Rowan County (Carter, Lewis, Greenup and Boyd) had been overcrowded more than 20% over their rated capacity for years. This would necessitate the transport of inmates to more distant facilities between 134- and 288-miles round trip.

New Rowan County Detention Center Completed in 2018



- In 2018, the ribbon was cut on a new \$19.3M facility with 279 beds.
- Our average annual bond payments total \$1.35M
- Today our facility is housing 331 inmates, with the following rough breakdown:
 - 1/3 Rowan County Inmates
 - 1/3 Other County Inmates
 - 1/3 State Inmates




Inmate Programs Offered




- The Rowan County Detention Center offers several programs aimed at reducing rates of recidivism and improving the lives of those incarcerated upon release, including:
 - Moral Reconation Therapy (MRT)
 - Anger Management
 - Portal (Parolee Orientation Reentry Training)
 - Health Relationships
 - GED
 - SCORE Program



COST SHARE PERCENTAGES OF ROWAN COUNTY DETENTION CENTER SORTED BY FUNDING SOURCE
















