






Operating Revenues Percent Change FY 2009-10 to FY 2019-20


• UK supports maintaining a 2 percent stop loss in FY 22 to limit the reallocation of existing base appropriations to the institutions

Percent Change in Bachelor's Degrees Produced by Targeted Metric Between Academic Years 2015-16 and 2018-19








Performance Funding Model Comparison of Kentucky Public Universities (Including UK) and the University of Kentucky

Percent Change in Bachelor's Degrees Produced by Targeted Metric Between Academic Years 2015-16 and 2018-19












University of Kentucky Kentucky Undergraduates Net Tuition & Mandatory Fees by Income Quartile

of our undergraduate full-time Kentucky students came from families with a median income of \$21,992. For these students, grants and scholarships covered 100% of tuition and mandatory fees.







UK LEADS Initiative Leveraging Economic Affordability for Developing Success



One Time Grant: Pilot Projects

Through the development of a statistical analysis aimed at predicting who is not being retained due to finances, a targeted intervention was administered to increase student persistence.



Kentucky Futures Scholarship

By creating a new scholarship aimed at students who are meritorious and also have unmet need, the institution is helping to recruit quality students and address retention issues prior to the start of the students' academic career.



Financial Wellness and Literacy

By expanding our Financial Wellness Office and tying institutional aid funds to required financial counseling, we are building out the financial literacy of our students.





Performance Funding & Mandated Programs

Cautionary note:


- State funds, less mandated programs, are subject to the Performance Funding Model
 - UK: \$261.0 million \$79.4 = \$181.6 million
- Governor recommended 1% increase in total state funds for FY21
 UK: \$261 million X 1% = \$2.6 million
- But... the mandated program funds, which are line-itemed in HB 352, have not been increased by the 1%. As a result, the allocation of future performance funds to UK will be negatively impacted
- Request: If there are any across-the-board or direct program increases to state
 General Funds, increase the mandated program line-itemed amounts accordingly





University of Kentucky Assessment of Financial Position

- Moody's Investors Service Bond Rating: Aa2 Stable
- Current debt structure is front-loaded with 32% amortizing over the next seven years
- FY20 debt service is 2.6% of operating budget – the lowest percentage in over a decade
