Princeton Station

Before Storms

- 2019 ribbon cutting for station's Grain and Forage Center of Excellence
- No-till research projects, precision agriculture application studies and many other pathbreaking studies and efforts



After Storms



We Will Rebuild

- Demolition and debris removal are expected to take at least four months.
- Working with equipment suppliers to replace damaged equipment.
- Established a rebuilding committee and temporary office space

Potential Projects

- Reynolds -- \$40 million
- Chem/Phys (partial) -- \$40 million
- Pence -- \$30 million
- Funkhouser (partial) -- \$75 million
- MDS/Nursing -- \$25 million
- Utility infrastructure and building systems -- \$40 million

Bucks for Brains

- Demonstrates how creative approaches help build stronger universities and, as a result, improve the lives of citizens across the Commonwealth
- Since the higher education reforms of 1997, external grants and awards at UK have grown from \$122 million annually to nearly \$470 million: a 284 percent increase
- As of June 30, 2021, the University of Kentucky has appointed a total of 210 faculty endowed chairs and professorships under the auspices of the Endowment Match Program
- Mark Evers, director of UK Markey Cancer Center, one of the top cancer centers in the country
