




OUR COOPERATIVE

- Increased our Cumberland River footprint with faster loading, fleeting services


COMMONWEALTH AGRI-ENERGY

- 45 million gallons denatured ethanol per year
- 97,000 tons DDGS per year
- 75,000 tons of CO2 per year
- 6,000 tons of corn oil per year
- Utilizes 16 million bushels of corn per year or 45,000 bushels per day
