

Initial funding

- Appropriations from General Fund (tobacco) appropriation
- FRSAN Federal Grant





Major accomplishments

- Expanded Crisis Call Center and upgraded equipment, helping with 988 rollout, 2,141,355 impressions and 44,218 clicks, leading to 36 calls to 988 via Raising Hope digital campaigns
- Increased QPR suicide response training capacity in agricultural communities, over 600 trained
- Trained healthcare professionals on how to help prevent suicide in agricultural communities through cultural humility-(CRUSH) a continuing education course. Over 380 have completed the course
- Captured and shared farmers' stories to show community appreciation
- Distributed 1,445 challenge coins as a caring support tool, developed training curriculum
- Developed a youth curriculum for students (ages 9-12) to be utilized and delivered by 4H agents in educational settings across the state
- Provided clinical training for rural mental health providers (CAMS, ASIST Training)
- Integrated communications and marketing campaign- reach of over 2.5 million
- Events impacting 260k people, including >2,500 health screenings
- At least 8 people are alive today, attributed to Raising Hope efforts



- Created Raising Hope By Laws and are currently gathering Advisory Council candidates to present to the Commissioner.
