



In **Dual Credit**, a student is enrolled in a course which allows him/her to earn high school credit and college credit simultaneously. This course may be taught on a college campus or on a high school campus, but it will be in conjunction with a college or university. Dual credit courses must comply with KRS <u>158.007(8)</u> which defined dual credit as "a college-level course of study developed in accordance with <u>KRS 164.098</u> in which a high school student receives credit from both the high school and postsecondary institution in which the student is enrolled upon completion of a single class or designated program of study."


