What is Governor's School for the Arts (GSA)?

- GSA is Kentucky Performing Arts' signature education program.
- Three week, residential, immersive, tuition-free summer program to empower the next generation of Kentucky's creative leaders.
- In 2022, 500+ Kentucky students and 75 support staff attended GSA.
- GSA related programs and activities have touched <u>ALL</u> 120 Kentucky counties.






OUR WORK: 24/7/365

- More than a summer program!
- Nearly 30 colleges/universities offer scholarships targeted to GSA alumni.
- GSA connects alumni to college representatives through an annual College/Career Day event.
- Grant funding, paid work, and ongoing mentorships available to alumni year-round.







THE APPLICATION PROCESS

How does a student apply?

- 1. Eligibility: current sophomores/juniors.
- 2. **Submission**: essay, questionnaire, artwork, recommendations, and application fee (waived for students on free/reduced lunch).
- **3. Selection:** applicant guide, and decision based on formal process but "in context" and location considerations.



In 2022, GSA received applications from **86 counties.**



In 2022, GSA had participants from **71 counties.**

GSA funding model:

- Since 1987, joint private/public partnership.
- Since 2020, state funding covers <50% of GSA program expenses
- 23% estimated for next year. (2023)
- Rely on individuals, corporations, and foundations to close the growing funding gap.

CREATING A TALENTED WORKFORCE AND BIGGER ECONOMY

GSA's mission: Empowering the next generation of Kentucky's creative leaders.

GSA Goals:

- Develop a highly skilled, diversified workforce inside and outside the arts.
- Hone interpersonal, communications and soft skills as well as build confidence in every facet of life.
- Help mold college-ready Kentuckians that are well positioned to excel in their coursework and eventually in the workplace.
- Inspire students to pursue their passions on and off the stage in Kentucky.
- Embrace creativity and individual talents.



PREPARING GSA GRADUATES FOR ACADEMIC AND PROFESSIONAL SUCCESS

By the numbers:

- 99% of GSA graduates later enrolled in college.
 - 67% attended college in Kentucky and 60%+ received a GSA-backed scholarship.
- 96% report being more aware & prepared for college/career opportunities.
- 92% are more likely to engage with people of differing viewpoints, backgrounds, and opinions.
- 92% of the GSA Class of 2022 said they were more likely to be an advocate for Kentucky.


