

1 AN ACT relating to scholarships.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔Section 1. KRS 164.786 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) For purposes of this section:

5 (a) "Academic term" means the fall or spring academic semester;

6 (b) "Academic year" means July 1 through June 30 of each year;

7 (c) "Approved dual credit course" means a dual credit course developed in
8 accordance with KRS 164.098 and shall include:

9 1. General education courses that meet the criteria outlined in the
10 statewide general education core approved by the Council on
11 Postsecondary Education; and

12 2. Career and technical education courses within a career pathway
13 approved by the Kentucky Department of Education that leads to an
14 industry-recognized credential;

15 (d) "Authority" means the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority;

16 (e) "Dual credit" has the same meaning as in KRS 158.007;

17 (f) "Dual credit tuition rate ceiling" means one-third (1/3) of the per credit hour
18 tuition amount, rounded down to the nearest whole dollar, charged by the
19 Kentucky Community and Technical College System for in-state students;

20 (g) "Eligible high school student" means a student who:

21 1. Is a Kentucky resident;

22 2. Is enrolled in a Kentucky high school~~[as a senior or junior];~~

23 3. Has completed a thirty (30) minute college success counseling session;
24 and

25 4. Is enrolled, or accepted for enrollment, in an approved dual credit course
26 at a participating institution;

27 (h) "Participating institution" means a postsecondary institution that:

- 1 1. Has an agreement with the authority for the administration of the Dual
2 Credit Scholarship Program;
- 3 2. Charges no more than the dual credit tuition rate ceiling per credit hour,
4 including any additional fees, for any approved dual credit course it
5 offers to any Kentucky public or nonpublic high school student;
- 6 3. Does not charge any tuition or fees to an eligible high school student for
7 an approved dual credit course beyond what is paid by the Dual Credit
8 Scholarship Program when the course is not successfully completed; and
- 9 4. Is a:
 - 10 a. Kentucky Community and Technical College System institution;
 - 11 b. Four (4) year Kentucky public college or university; or
 - 12 c. Four (4) year private college or university that is accredited by the
13 Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and whose main
14 campus is located in Kentucky; and
- 15 (i) "Successfully completed" means a student receiving both secondary and
16 postsecondary credit upon completion of an approved dual credit course.
- 17 (2) To promote dual credit coursework opportunities at no cost to eligible Kentucky
18 high school students, the General Assembly hereby establishes the Dual Credit
19 Scholarship Program.
- 20 (3) In consultation with the Council on Postsecondary Education and the Kentucky
21 Department of Education ~~and Labor Cabinet~~, the authority shall administer the
22 Dual Credit Scholarship Program and shall promulgate administrative regulations in
23 accordance with KRS Chapter 13A as may be needed for the administration of the
24 program.
- 25 (4) (a) Each high school shall apply to the authority for dual credit scholarship funds
26 for each eligible high school student.
- 27 (b) The authority may award a dual credit scholarship to an eligible high school

1 student for an academic term on a first-come, first-served basis by
2 application date, to the extent funds are available for that purpose~~[, except~~
3 ~~that a scholarship shall be awarded to an eligible high school senior prior to~~
4 ~~awarding an eligible high school junior].~~

5 (c) An eligible high school student may receive a dual credit scholarship for a
6 maximum of:

7 1. a. Two (2) *career and technical education*~~successfully completed]~~
8 dual credit courses per academic year; and

9 b. Two (2) general education dual credit courses over the junior
10 and senior year; or

11 2. Beginning with the 2026-2027 academic year, for an eligible high
12 school student in a teaching and learning career pathway, a total of
13 twenty (20) dual credit courses, which shall not exceed eight (8)
14 courses per academic year, that are required for admission to a
15 teacher education program in pursuit of initial teacher certification.

16 (d) The dual credit scholarship award amount shall be equal to the amount
17 charged by a participating institution, not to exceed the dual credit
18 tuition rate ceiling for each dual credit hour~~[, except the scholarship~~
19 ~~amount shall be reduced by fifty percent (50%) if the dual credit course~~
20 ~~is not successfully completed by the student].~~

21 (e) Dual credit scholarship funds shall not be used for remedial or developmental
22 coursework.

23 (5) Each participating institution shall submit information each academic term to the
24 authority required for the administration of the scholarship as determined by the
25 authority.

26 (6) ~~[Beginning August 1, 2017, and each year thereafter,]~~The authority shall provide
27 an annual~~[a]~~ report to the secretary of the Education and Labor Cabinet, the

1 president of the Council on Postsecondary Education, and the commissioner of the
2 Kentucky Department of Education to include:

3 (a) The number of students, by local school district and in total, served by the
4 Dual Credit Scholarship Program; and

5 (b) The number of general education and career and technical education dual
6 credits earned by students by high school and in total.

7 (7) By May 31 ~~of, 2019, and~~ each year ~~thereafter~~, the Kentucky Center for ~~Education and Workforce~~ Statistics, in collaboration with the authority, shall
8 publish data on the Dual Credit Scholarship Program's academic and workforce
9 outcomes. The center shall annually provide a report on the data to the Legislative
10 Research Commission for referral to the appropriate Interim Joint Committee on
11 Education.

13 (8) (a) The Dual Credit Scholarship Program trust fund is hereby created as a trust
14 fund in the State Treasury to be administered by the Kentucky Higher
15 Education Assistance Authority for the purpose of providing scholarships
16 described in this section.

17 (b) The trust fund shall consist of state general fund appropriations, gifts and
18 grants from public and private sources, and federal funds.~~All moneys~~
19 ~~included in the fund shall be appropriated for the purposes set forth in this~~
20 ~~section.~~

21 (c) Any unallotted~~unalloted~~ or unencumbered balances in the trust fund shall be
22 invested as provided in KRS 42.500(9). Income earned from the investments
23 shall be credited to the trust fund.

24 (d) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any fund balance at the close of the fiscal year
25 shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year ~~and~~

27 ➔Section 2. KRS 164.787 is amended to read as follows:

- 1 (1) The General Assembly hereby establishes the Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship
2 Program to ensure that all Kentuckians who have not yet earned a postsecondary
3 degree have affordable access to an industry-recognized certificate, diploma, or
4 associate of applied science degree and, for students with intellectual disabilities
5 enrolled in comprehensive transition and postsecondary programs, affordable
6 access to meaningful credentials to prepare for competitive integrated employment.
- 7 (2) For purposes of this section:
- 8 (a) "Academic term" means a fall, spring, or summer academic term or other time
9 period specified in an administrative regulation promulgated by the authority;
- 10 (b) "Academic year" means July 1 through June 30 of each year;
- 11 (c) ~~["Approved dual credit course" means a dual credit course developed in~~
12 ~~accordance with KRS 164.098 that is a career and technical education course~~
13 ~~within a career pathway approved by the Kentucky Department of Education~~
14 ~~that leads to an industry-recognized credential;~~
- 15 (d) ~~"Dual credit tuition rate ceiling" means the same as defined in 164.786;~~
- 16 (e) ~~}]~~ "Eligible institution" means an institution as defined in KRS 164.001 that:
- 17 1. Actively participates in the federal Pell Grant program;
- 18 2. Executes a contract with the authority on terms the authority deems
19 necessary or appropriate for the administration of its programs; and
- 20 3. ~~[Charges no more than the dual credit tuition rate ceiling per credit hour,~~
21 ~~including any additional fees, for any dual credit course it offers to any~~
22 ~~Kentucky public or nonpublic high school student; and~~
- 23 4. ~~}]~~ Is a:
- 24 a. Kentucky Community and Technical College System institution;
- 25 b. Kentucky public university; or
- 26 c. College, university, or vocational-technical school that is
27 accredited by a recognized regional or national accrediting body

and licensed to operate at a site in Kentucky;

~~(d)(f)~~ "Eligible program of study" means a program approved by the authority that leads to an industry-recognized certificate, diploma, or associate of applied science degree in one (1) of Kentucky's top five (5) high-demand workforce sectors identified by the Kentucky Workforce Innovation Board and the Education and Labor Cabinet or a program of study in a comprehensive transition and postsecondary program that leads to a credential, certificate, diploma, or degree;

~~(e)(g)~~ "Fees" means mandatory fees charged by an eligible institution for enrollment in a course, including but not limited to online course fees, lab fees, and administrative fees. "Fees" does not include tools, books, or other instructional materials that may be required for a course; and

~~(f)(h)~~ "Tuition" means the in-state tuition charged to all students as a condition of enrollment in an eligible institution.

(3) In consultation with the Education and Labor Cabinet, ~~the Kentucky Department of Education,~~ and the Council on Postsecondary Education, the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority shall administer the Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship Program and promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A as may be needed for the administration of the scholarship.

(4) ~~An eligible high school student shall:~~

~~(a) Be a Kentucky resident;~~

~~(b) Be enrolled in a Kentucky high school;~~

~~(c) Be enrolled, or accepted for enrollment, in an approved dual credit course at an eligible institution; and~~

~~(d) Complete and submit a Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship dual credit application to the authority.~~

~~(5) An eligible workforce student shall:~~

- 1 (a) Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States;
- 2 (b) Be a Kentucky resident as determined by the eligible institution in accordance
3 with criteria established by the Council on Postsecondary Education for the
4 purposes of admission and tuition assessment;
- 5 (c) 1. Have earned a high school diploma or a High School Equivalency
6 Diploma or be enrolled in a High School Equivalency Diploma
7 program; or
8 2. For a student enrolled in a comprehensive transition and postsecondary
9 program, have received an alternative high school diploma described in
10 KRS 158.140(2)(b) or have attended a Kentucky public high school and
11 is a student with an intellectual disability as defined in 34 C.F.R. sec.
12 668.231;
- 13 (d) Not have earned an associate's degree or higher level postsecondary degree;
- 14 (e) Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the academic year
15 in which the scholarship is awarded;
- 16 (f) Complete and submit a Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship application to the
17 authority;
- 18 (g) Enroll in an eligible program of study at an eligible institution;
- 19 (h) Not be enrolled in an ineligible degree program, such as a bachelor or
20 unapproved associate program, at any postsecondary institution;
- 21 (i) Following the first academic term scholarship funds are received, achieve and
22 maintain satisfactory academic progress as determined by the eligible
23 institution; and
- 24 (j) Not be in default on any program under Title IV of the federal act or any
25 obligation to the authority under any program administered by the authority
26 under KRS 164.740 to 164.7891 or 164.7894, except that ineligibility for this
27 reason may be waived by the authority for cause.

1 ~~(5)~~~~(6)~~ (a) ~~{Beginning with the 2019-2020 academic year, }~~The authority shall
2 award a Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship each academic term to any person
3 who meets the requirements of this section to the extent funds are available
4 for that purpose.

5 (b) The scholarship amount awarded to an eligible workforce student for an
6 academic term shall be the amount remaining after subtracting the student's
7 federal and state grants and scholarships from the maximum scholarship
8 amount. The maximum scholarship amount shall be the per credit hour in-
9 state tuition rate at the Kentucky Community and Technical College System
10 multiplied by the number of credit hours in which the student is enrolled and
11 the fees charged to the student. The authority shall promulgate an
12 administrative regulation in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A to specify the
13 maximum amount to be awarded for fees~~, except that for the 2019-2020~~
14 ~~academic year the amount awarded for fees shall not exceed four hundred~~
15 ~~dollars (\$400).~~

16 ~~(c) The scholarship award for an eligible high school student shall be limited to~~
17 ~~two (2) approved dual credit courses per academic year. The scholarship~~
18 ~~amount awarded shall be equal to the amount charged by an eligible~~
19 ~~institution for an approved dual credit course, in accordance with subsection~~
20 ~~(2)(c)3. of this section].~~

21 ~~(6)~~~~(7)~~ (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, an eligible
22 workforce student's eligibility for the scholarship shall terminate upon the
23 earlier of:

- 24 1. Receiving the scholarship for a total of sixty (60) credit hours; or
- 25 2. Obtaining an associate's degree.

26 (b) For an eligible workforce student enrolled in a comprehensive transition and
27 postsecondary program, eligibility for the scholarship shall terminate upon the

1 earlier of completing the program or receiving the scholarship for up to nine
2 (9) academic terms within three (3) academic years.

3 ~~(7)~~(8) The authority shall annually provide a report on the Work Ready Kentucky
4 Scholarship Program, prepared in collaboration with the Kentucky Center~~[Office]~~
5 for~~[Education and Workforce]~~ Statistics, to the secretary of the Education and
6 Labor Cabinet and the Legislative Research Commission for referral to the
7 appropriate Interim Joint Committee on Education that includes, by academic
8 term, academic year, institution, and workforce sector, the number of:

- 9 (a) Students served by the scholarship and the total amount disbursed;
10 (b) Credits, certificates, diplomas, and associate of applied science degrees earned
11 by students receiving the scholarship; and
12 (c) Students receiving the scholarship who are enrolled in a comprehensive
13 transition and postsecondary program and credentials earned by those
14 students.

15 ~~(8)~~(9) The authority shall report Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship program data to
16 the Kentucky Center~~[Office]~~ for~~[Education and Workforce]~~ Statistics for analysis
17 of the program's success in meeting the goal of increasing skilled workforce
18 participation rates.

19 ~~(9)~~(10) (a) The Work Ready Kentucky Scholarship fund is hereby created as a trust
20 fund in the State Treasury to be administered by the authority for the purpose
21 of providing scholarships as described in this section.
