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School Improvement Classifications

Status	ID Cycle	Criteria
Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI)	Annually	 Bottom 5% of Schools by Level Graduation Rate Below 80% Failed to Exit ATSI Status
Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI)	Annually	A subgroup performing at or below the bottom 5% by level for three consecutive years.
Additional Targeted Support and Improvement (ATSI)	Every Three Years	Identified as TSI the year prior to identification and did not exit.



The Policy Context

- The identification of schools in need of improvement is mandated by the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015.
- Kentucky's process is governed by KRS 160.346 and 704 KAR 5:280.
- SB 158 (2020) amended KRS 160.346 and placed CSI identification on a three-year cycle. It also created a new calculation for CSI identification that requires the KDE to use an average of three years of change when determining the bottom five percent.
- Waivers offered by the US Department of Education in response to the COVID-19 pandemic delayed the implementation of SB 158 (2020) until the 2022 identification cycle.
- HB 298 (2025) returned the CSI identification cycle to an annual cycle.

A Statutory and Regulatory Process

The process for CSI can be found in KRS 160.346 and 703 KAR 5:280.

- 1. Schools are identified based on the state's accountability system.
- 2. Schools receive support from the KDE on day one; provided by Education Recovery (ER) Staff.
- 3. Schools and districts undergo a Diagnostic Review.
- 4. Schools and districts develop a three-year turnaround plan that is approved by the local Board of Education and the KDE.
- 5. The KDE issues federal School Improvement Fund (SIF) grants.
- 6. Schools and districts implement their plans.



KDE's Support for CSI Schools

- The KDE provides the following supports:
 - Mentoring and providing support to school leadership
 - Assisting with standard, curriculum, instruction, and assessment alignment
 - Delivering timely, job-embedded professional learning
 - Supporting the continuous improvement process through planning and monitoring
 - Support resolving issues with compliance and reporting
 - Access to strategic partners such as Carnegie, Cognia, Shipley, NISL,
 Cognitive Coaching, and Rutherford Learning Group.



Support for TSI and ATSI Schools

- The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015 requires that <u>local</u> school districts intervene to support their TSI schools.
- TSI schools must:
 - Amend their Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP) to include:
 - Components of turnaround leadership;
 - The identification of critical resource inequities;
 - Evidence-based interventions; and
 - Additional actions taken to support students from consistently underperforming groups.



KDE's Supports for TSI Schools

- In 2023-24 and 2024-25, the KDE was able to provide support to TSI schools due to the CSI identification cycles.
- KDE support for TSI schools was optional all TSI schools were given notice and opportunity to opt in.
- Schools who opted-in to TSI support received:
 - Continuous Improvement Review;
 - Strategic Planning Support;
 - Needs Assessment Analysis;
 - Professional Learning;
 - Leadership Coaching and Support;

- PLC Development Support;
- Leadership Team Retreats;
- Walkthrough Support;
- Data Analysis Support; and
- MTSS Development Support.



The Kentucky Educational Recovery Fund

- TSI schools who participated in KDE's supports:
 - 24 Schools who received KDE supports in 2023-24 or 2024-25 either exited TSI status or did not fall into ATSI or CSI Status.
- To continue the success of the TSI support program deployed in 2023-24 and 2024-25, the KDE has submitted an ABR to create the "Kentucky Educational Recovery Fund".
- These funds (\$4,000,000 per year) will allow the KDE to continue its support of TSI schools.
