March 1, 2023

Call to Order and Roll Call

Economic Development Cabinet

Mr. Noel replied to Chair Fugate that the most significant challenges regarding economic development projects in rural Kentucky are understanding what communities offer, attracting companies that fit, concentrating on manufacturers' supply chains, logistical issues such as road improvements, and the perception of the workforce. Mr. Noel agreed to the cabinet working with Chair Fugate to discuss the trail system as economic development in eastern Kentucky.

Lindy Casebier, Secretary; Russ Meyer, Commissioner, Department of Parks; and Ron VanOver, Deputy Commissioner, Department of Parks, Tourism, Arts, and Heritage Cabinet, shared information regarding the Kentucky Department of Parks' profitability.
