


KRS 230.826 and 908 KAR 2:300 requires

- Available services to reduce the consequences of problem gambling.








#### Revenue by Quarter


Request for proposals to strengthen the ability of the existing behavioral health workforce to understand, identify, and treat problem gambling issues.



#### NATIONAL PROBLEM GAMBLING HELPLINE

Call 1-800-GAMBLER (1-800-426-2537) to connect with hotline staff who will send you more information about problem gambling or make a referral to the closest problem gambling counselor or Gamblers Anonymous meeting.

#### KENTUCKY COUNCIL ON PROBLEM GAMBLING

Learn about problem gambling, determine whether you or someone you know may have a gambling problem, and obtain referral information for assistance with problem gambling.



#### GAMBLERS ANONYMOUS (GA)

GAMBLERS ANONYMOUS is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from a gambling problem.



#### 988 SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE

The Lifeline responds 24/7 to calls, chats, or texts from anyone who needs support for suicidal, mental health, and/or substance use crisis, and connects those in need with trained crisis counselors.



#### PROBLEM GAMBLING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The program website provides information about safe gambling practices, the risks of developing a gambling problem, awareness of the risk factors and warning signs of gambling problems, and access to services to address the reduction of the consequences of problem gambling.
