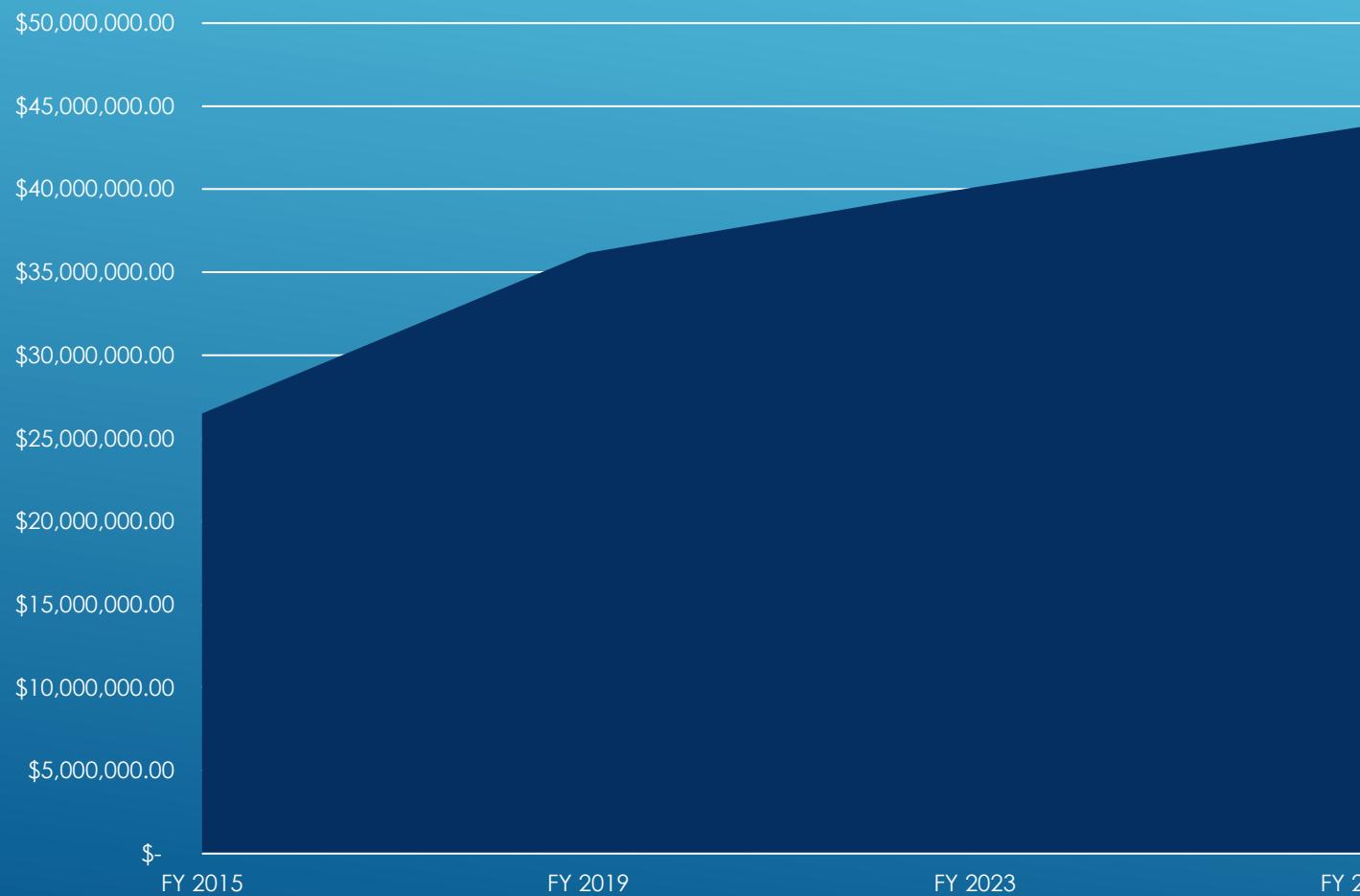

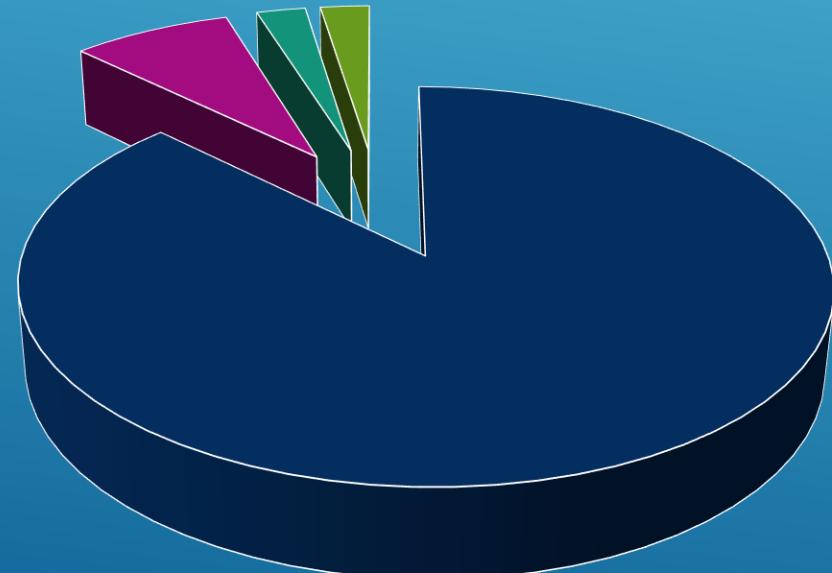

- The Role of the 911 Services Board is to collect and distribute the wireless 911 surcharge
 - 95% of this money is returned to local Public Service Answer Points (PSAPs)

- ▶ FY 2020 – New state NG911 road map completed
- ▶ FY 2023 – Over 700 monitors/workstations distributed to PSAP's for data portal display at no cost
- ▶ FY 2025 – RFP issued and NG911 vendor selected, Comtech-Allerium. Project kick-off was March 2025.
- ▶ FY 2026 – PSAP's are being migrated to the NG911 platform

- ▶ #1 Challenge: FCC 51.305 requires that phone companies be provided a local point of interconnection (POI) for phone providers to connect to
- ▶ #2 Challenge: Additional circuits were needed to upgrade equipment before the first migration could happen.

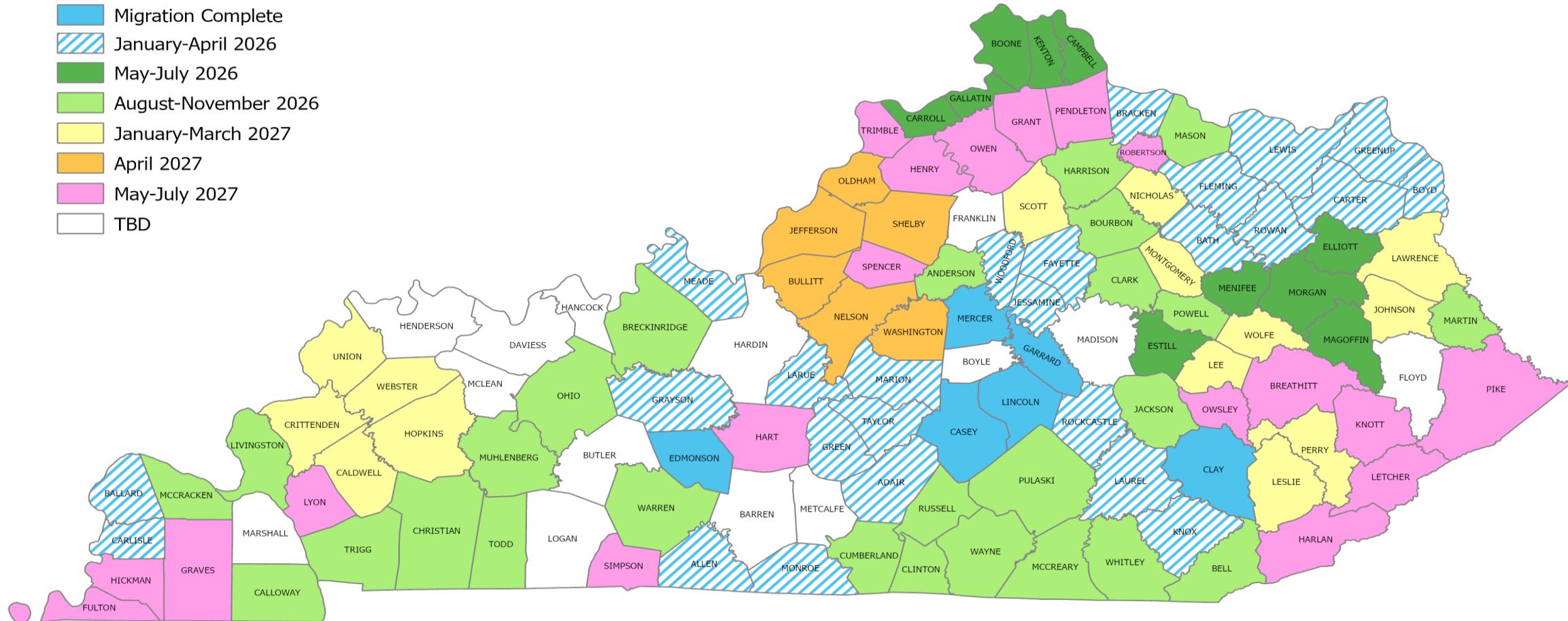

- ▶ Rave Link – allowing the PSAP to share information by a click of the mouse.
