### **Our Time is Here**

- Governor Beshear, Ford Motor Company, and SK Innovation announced a \$5.8 billion investment to create 5,000 jobs
  - The single largest economic development project in Kentucky's history
- Since 2020, economic growth in manufacturing projects have contributed to the Commonwealth's overall growth
  - 200 new location and expansion announcements
  - Over 13,500 jobs have been created
  - \$10 billion in new investment
- Over 200 jobs created through the Kentucky Small Business Tax Credit

### **Moving Kentucky Forward: Broadband**

#### American Rescue Plan Act

- Invested \$300 million to expand broadband to unserved and underserved communities
- First \$50 million grant proposals due on October 25
- Kentucky Broadband Initiative
  - Crowdsourced internet speed test to expand home access for home learning, telework, and telehealth







# **Moving Kentucky Forward: Continued**

- Work Opportunity Tax Credit Certifications
  - The Office of Employer & Apprenticeship Services saw a 59% increase in certifications from prior fiscal year
- KY Transformational Employment Program (KTEP)/Kentucky Comeback
  - Partnership between CHFS, ODCP, & KY Chamber of Commerce to assist employers in hiring and retaining employees with substance use disorders through long-term recovery

#### • Fair Chance Hiring

• Putting Kentuckians First Toolkit of best practices for working with the justiceinvolved workforce population







# **Moving Kentucky Forward: Continued**

#### Aviation Industry

• An upcoming statewide industry gathering will review workforce challenges and opportunities to support the critical and heavily pandemic impacted industry

#### Information Technology (Code Kentucky & Commonwealth Coders)

- Code Kentucky is an expansion of Code Louisville and is expanding into NKY and Eastern Kentucky to train individuals in in-demand high paying jobs that could be done remotely
- Commonwealth Coders is a 16-week web developer training course to prepare students for job in the IT industry in the Bluegrass, South Central, Cumberlands, and NKY regions







### **Early Childhood Employment Pipeline**

- Early Childhood Registered Apprenticeship for high school students established in 2019
- As of 2021, 26 employers serving 48 locations have registered









# Line Tech Program

- Critical in-demand jobs of line technicians are accompanied by family-sustaining high wages
- Kentucky electrical contractors who are seeking to diversify their workforce can hire additional line tech to meet current and future demands









# **Additional EWDC Programs**

#### • Commercial Drivers Licenses (CDL) Training

- KCTCS Facilities: Ashland, Big Sandy, Elizabethtown, Gateway, Henderson, Hopkinsville, Madisonville, Maysville, Somerset
- Additionally, 13 proprietary schools offer training

#### Proprietary Schools

• Private training schools for workers interested in trades, such as welding, refrigeration, and real estate

#### Registered Apprenticeship Website Launch

• Ease of access and support for employers in recruitment, retention, and workforce initiatives

#### • Fair Chance Hiring

- Partnering with other entities to remove barriers and support employers with services such as the Federal Bonding Program
- Putting Kentuckians First Toolkit of best practices for working with the justice associated workforce population







### **Education is Workforce Development**

- Adult Education & Kentucky Skills U
  - Nearly 23,000 individuals enrolled since January 2020
- Free GED Campaign
  - 4,673 individuals have taken the full GED exam since January 2020
  - 79% have earned their GED

#### • The Excel Center

• Partnership with Goodwill to provide Kentuckians 18 or older pathways to achieve high school diplomas and other industry recognized certifications

#### Governor's School for Entrepreneurs

- 600 program alums have started 20+ businesses and filed for multiple patents
- Summer Enrichment Program
  - Partnership with Lt. Governor's Office, KDE and Kentucky Environmental Education Council for 3,000 students to attend summer enrichment program
