










Eastern Kentucky flood response





























- Five counties in western Kentucky will remain under special regulations for deer disease monitoring during the 2022-23 seasons.
- The disease has **not** been found in Kentucky.
- Disease monitoring regulations in place this season for the CWD Surveillance Zone in western Kentucky include:
 - Mandatory CWD Check Stations for select dates during modern gun season.
 - No feeding or baiting of deer at any time in the CWD Surveillance Zone.
 - No transportation of harvested deer carcasses, their intact heads or other high-risk parts out of the CWD Surveillance Zone.



All deer harvested in Calloway, Fulton, Graves, Hickman and Marshall counties by any method during the following dates must be brought to a CWD Check Station for sampling: Nov. 12-14 (Saturday-Monday), Nov. 19-21 (Saturday-Monday), Nov. 26-27 (Saturday-Sunday)

Our Kentucky Wild program continues to grow:

- 11,432 all time memberships for a total of \$436,470.00
- July-September 2022 memberships: 782 members for a total of \$30,320.00
- Members from ALL 50 states









Fish stocking

KDFWR operates two fish hatcheries: Peter W. Pfeiffer just north of Frankfort and Minor E. Clark near Morehead.

The hatcheries produced and stocked a total of **6.1 million fish** weighing 169,566 pounds for fish stocking across the Commonwealth.

In addition, the department stocked **750,000 trout** raised at Wolf Creek National Fish Hatchery below Lake Cumberland to stocking sites across the state.

Invasive carp

- Commercial fishers harvested **10,106,385 pounds** of invasive carp statewide over the past 12 months.
- Kentucky Fish and Wildlife facilitated the harvest of **8,539,739 pounds** of invasive carp from Kentucky and Barkley lakes and paid out over \$650,000 in subsidy payments directly to commercial fishers in the last 12 months.


















New system for categorizing Kentucky's WMAs





Prescribed fire: An efficient tool for habitat enhancement



Elk hunting in Kentucky

- 2 bull elk harvested in 2021 that made the top 10 list of largest elk harvested in Kentucky.
- Largest elk ever harvested in Kentucky was taken in 2021 (392 3/8 Boone and Crockett Score).
- Bull harvested in Martin Co by a drawn hunter from Morehead that harvested this elk by himself.
- Boone and Crockett Score of 377 4/8
 - #2 Largest typical harvested in Kentucky
 - 5th Largest elk ever harvested in Kentucky
- 2022 is the 25th Anniversary of Elk Restoration.
