Biennium Bridges

- \$340 million approved in FY 2018-19
- Nearly 350 bridges
- Deliver to construction in 2019-20 biennium

- Bridge Screening Wrapping Up
- Move projects to construction





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Next steps

Construction Phase

- Starting rehab projects this year
- Large volume of rehabs/replacements in 2019
- Steady flow of projects through 2024





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
