Why Design-Build (D-B) vs Traditional Design-Bid-Build (D-B-B)

Time Management and Risk Management

- Flexibility to begin relocation of utilities while finalizing design or acquiring right of way
- Flexibility to begin construction while acquiring rights of entry (R/W) | better time utilization
- Flexibility to begin construction while collaborating with Norfolk Southern Railroad and the multiple rail components affected
- Multiple projects gives contractor control over road/ramp closures to minimize impacts to driving public as affecting both interchanges
- Allows for construction innovation by providing contractors an extended period of time (~ 5 months) to strategize a plan of construction as opposed to the 21 days of D-B-B
- Provides best opportunity to meet time-sensitive INFRA commitments

Anticipated Cost Savings


- D-B gives flexibility for contractor to begin construction sooner
 - Rewards: Reduction of daily congestion delays increases movement of commuters, goods, and services
 - Rewards: Benefits future economic development encourages new commercial/industry or expansion of existing commercial/industry enterprises
- Complete Construction Sooner: extended construction seasons result in higher construction costs due to increased construction cost index; the sooner projects can be constructed provides the optimal construction cost



2019 INFRA Grant Submittal

I-265 Improvements – I-265 Widening and I-64/I-265 Interchange Reconstruction

- Grant application was submitted on March 4, 2019
- Requested \$20 M in INFRA Funds to be match with \$37.6 M other Federal and \$20 M State
- Total Future Project Cost \$77.6 M
- Project- Widening of I-265 from KY 155 (Taylorsville Rd) to KY 3084 (Old Henry Road) totaling 5.6 miles. Reconstruction of I-65/I-265 Interchange to eliminate cloverleaf configuration to improve safety and reduce congestion.
- Announcement of Awards expected by July 15, 2019

2019 BUILD Grant Opportunity

- \$900 million to be awarded by USDOT
- \$450 M for Urban Projects (>200,000 pop.), requiring 20% match
- \$450 M for Rural Projects (≤200,000 pop.), no match required
- \$90 M maximum award amount per state
- \$25 M maximum award per project
- KYTC is providing funding for the development of 10 BUILD Grant applications to be submitted by the respective counties
- Applications due July 15, 2019
- Announcement of awards by November 12, 2019
- Grant funding must be obligated by September 30, 2021
