

## DRMA Funding Options



#### **FUNDING OPTIONS**



Counties and Cities may also apply for TAP funding and CMAQ funding which are federally funded 80/20 match programs.





- The Highway Construction Contingency Account, also known as the Discretionary Fund (FD-39), is administered by the Department of Rural and Municipal Aid.
- Discretionary Funding may be used for transportation projects across the Commonwealth, including but not limited to:
  - Resurfacing, and
  - Bridge repair/replacement



#### Types of projects that may qualify for Funding:

- Projects that present a hazardous condition as assessed by the Chief District Engineer's Offices of your district;
- 2) Projects that promote economic or industrial development;
  Only since FY 2021 has the General Assembly suspended portions of KRS 45.247 eliminating the Contingency Account's use for this purpose.
- 3) Projects related to Safety/Emergency issues.

#### **Level of Need for Funding**

This funding option requires a higher threshold of need outside what is met through other Cabinet/Department programs.

The Discretionary Fund receives an annual allocation of funds from the budget **adopted by the General Assembly** as indicated in KRS 45.247, which states in part:

"45.247 Highway construction contingency account.

There is created within the road fund the highway construction contingency account. *The account shall consist of moneys appropriated to the account by the General Assembly....*"



### HISTORICAL FUNDING LEVELS

#### Facts:

- Per KRS 45.247, this fund receives an annual allocation from the budget adopted by the General Assembly.
- Each fiscal year, deductions from this amount are mandated and include \$1.6 million to Short-Line Railroad assistance, \$5 million to the Kentucky Pride Fund (which was reduced to \$4 million in FY23) and \$290,000 to the Kentucky Transportation Center.

  Note: An additional \$10 million was added in HB193 by the Legislature for FY 2021.
- In FY 2017-2020 the allocation to this fund was \$31 million per year. Less deductions, the funds remaining to assist counties and cities were approximately \$24.1 million.
- In FY 2021-2024 the allocation was reduced to \$16.6 million per year. Less deductions, the funds remaining to assist counties and cities were approximately \$10.7 million.

# EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS THROUGHOUT THE STATE





Funding Map (FD-39, TAP & CMAQ) 1/1/2020 – 3/23/2023






# LACK OF FUNDING RESULTS IN ROADS LIKE THIS ALL OVER THE STATE






