> HB 1 2024 Riverport Funding

- \$18.5 million for the Riverport Asset Preservation Program
 - \$7,500,000 in each fiscal year to the general administration and support budget at KYTC to improve public riverports for construction and maintenance

> Funding Status

Nearly all funding in each fiscal year has been awarded

> 2026 Request

- \$30 million for the Riverport Asset Preservation Program.
 - Allow funding in the first year and to carryforward over the two-year period
 - Maintain annual funding of \$500,000 in the Riverport Financial Assistance Trust Fund

> HB 1 2024 Rail Funding

- \$15 million for the short line infrastructure preservation program within the Kentucky Rail Development Program (KSLIP)
- \$15 million for the industrial access and safety program within the Kentucky Rail Development Program (KASI)

> Funding Status

Nearly all funding in each fiscal year has been awarded

> 2026 Request

Reauthorize same funding levels as 2024: \$15M for KSLIP and \$15M for KIASI

AVIATION



> HB 1 Aviation

- \$35,000,000 in fiscal year 2024-2025 to support Economic Development and commercial airports
- \$11.6 M for General Aviation airport support allocating \$200,000 to each GA

> Funding Status

All funding in each fiscal year has been awarded

> 2026 Request

- Advanced Air Mobility (AAM) Study
- Support the funding requests and work of KAA, General Aviation Airports and our Commercial Service Airports

PUBLIC TRANSIT

- > HB 265 2024 Transportation Cabinet Budget \$10,575,800 each year
- > Challenges and Opportunities
 - Paratransit unfunded federal mandate
 - First-Mile/Last-Mile (FM/LM) connections: micromobility
 - Workforce
 - Housing
- > 2026 Request
 - Continue funding Public Transit at levels to support the Commonwealth's needs

> HB 1 2024 Funding

- \$450M General Fund Transfer
- City County Programs (LARP)

Funding Concerns

- Gas tax dollars = 2015 levels
- Cars are more fuel efficient
- EV fees are lowest of surrounding states, hybrid fees eliminated
- Only level 3 chargers are taxable for kw/hr (many exempt)

2026 Request

- Continue with short term support with a GF transfer
- Address ways to modernize Road Funding
 - Adjust EV fees & consider other fuel sources as appropriate
 - Continue to reduce diversions
 - What's next long term strategy for transportation funding
 - Change MFT index from AWP of fuel to Construction Cost Index
