

2018 Citizen Foster Care Review Board Regional Community Forums

Summary of Findings

During the 2018 Legislative Session, the Kentucky General Assembly passed House Bill 1 which included the following mandates for the Citizen Foster Care Review Boards (CFCRB) effective July 16, 2018.

KRS 620.270 (5) At least twice annually, the local citizen foster care review boards shall participate in regional community forums for members of the public to discuss areas of concern regarding the foster care system and to identify barriers to timely permanency, well-being and safety for children in out-of-home care. The boards shall report their findings to the State Citizen Foster Care Review Board in accordance with KRS 620.340.

KRS 620.320 (5) Evaluate and make annual recommendations to the Supreme Court, Governor, and the Child Welfare Oversight and Advisory Committee established in Section 1 of 17 this Act regarding: (a) Laws of the Commonwealth; (b) Practices, policies, and procedures within the Commonwealth affecting permanence for children in out-ofhome placement and the investigation of allegations of abuse and neglect; (c) The findings of the local citizen foster care review board community forums conducted pursuant to Section 23 of this Act; and (d) The effectiveness or lack thereof and reasons therefor of local citizen foster care review of children in the custody of the cabinet in bringing about permanence for the Commonwealth's children.

In accordance with the Kentucky Revised Statutes above, the CFCRB held Regional Community Forums across the state. The forum dates and locations are as follows:

- August 24, 2018 Elizabethtown (Hardin County)
- September 21, 2018 Salyersville (Magoffin County)
- September 25, 2018 Lexington (Fayette County)
- September 28, 2018 Madisonville (Hopkins County)
- October 19, 2018 Florence (Boone County)
- October 26, 2018 Somerset (Pulaski County)
- October 29, 2018 Louisville (Jefferson County)

The following is a summary of findings compiled from the seven CFCRB Regional Forums held in 2018. Findings are based on recommendations and concerns raised by members of the public and have been categorized by parties or stakeholder groups affected. Pursuant to KRS 620.320 (5); the CFCRB has made recommendations which include these findings to the Supreme Court, Governor, and the Child Welfare Oversight and Advisory Committee.

Children's Issues & Concerns

- Lack of Department of Community Based Services staff, lack of funding, lack of visitation locations, and lack of services
- Transitional services for adoptive children
- Lessen county to county transfers

Relative/Kinship Care Issues & Concerns

- Compensation and information on accessible services
- Kinship Care Hotline needs more workers
- Continued Quality Improvement process for payment of vouchers is needed
- *Guardians ad Litem* need to be more accountable
- Stricter review of timelines
- More Family Court judgeships

 Definitive information needed regarding who qualifies for financial support as fictive and kinship caregivers

Court Issues & Concerns

- Termination of Parental Rights process should be more streamlined
- House Bill 1 information, training, outcomes
- Barriers involving county and state lines

Overall Comments & Suggestions

- Adopted children should still receive services
- Mental health of foster parents and Department for Community Based Services workers is important
- Family mentorship programs should be utilized
- Foster parent recruitment should focus on diversity and cultural sensitivity
