Earliest Date to File for Office & Affix Signatures: November 7, 2018

Party Candidates

- Filing Deadline: January 29, 2019, 4:00 p.m.
- Drawing for ballot position: January 31, 2019, 2:00 p.m.

Independent/Other Candidates

- Filing Deadline for Independents, Political Organization & Political Group Candidates:
 - April 1, 2019, 4:00 p.m. -- Declaration of Intent
 - August 13, 2019, 4:00 p.m. -- Petition
- Drawing for ballot position: August 15, 2019, 2:00 p.m.



Important Dates:

Primary Election: May 21, 2019

General Election: November 5, 2019




- 3 ½ year effort to bring e-poll books to the Commonwealth.
- Utilized federal Help America Vote Act (HAVA) funds for the purchase for all 120 counties.
- Conducted two pilot projects in 2016 Primary & 2016
 General Elections
 - 7 counties
- Rolled out in original 7 counties in 2018 Primary Election
 - Franklin & Madison placed in every precinct






Types of IDs Used

Madison County




Franklin County






E-Poll BooksAverage Check-In Time in *Seconds*






E-Poll BooksNumber of Check-Ins by Hour

2019 Elections Legislation

Early Voting

- Remove excuse requirement for in-person absentee voting
- Leave in place requirement to open in-person absentee no later than 12 working days before Election Day

• Online Voter Registration Deadline

Remove 4 p.m. deadline

Emergency Absentee Voting

- Allow for delivery of absentee ballots to voters by email
- Emergency absentee ballots (problem for forest fire fighters)
