- Best Practices
 - Policy oriented
- Technical Standards
 - Technology oriented



eRecording Best Practices

- The XML technical standards support a wide variety of local traditions
- "Best Practice" policies will vary based on state law



- XML DTDs and Schemas
 - Defines and organizes the data used in a transaction

- Expanding to accommodate industry needs
 - Version 1 Document content only
 - Version 2 Request/Response information added
 - Version 3 Preparing for next generation technology



- Adopted and implemented by all technology vendors currently working in the industry
- Some states have formally adopted
- Some states have taken a "de facto" approach



- Coordinated with the mortgage and land tile industry
 - MISMO/PRIA Alliance Agreement
 - Ensures interoperability across the life of a loan
