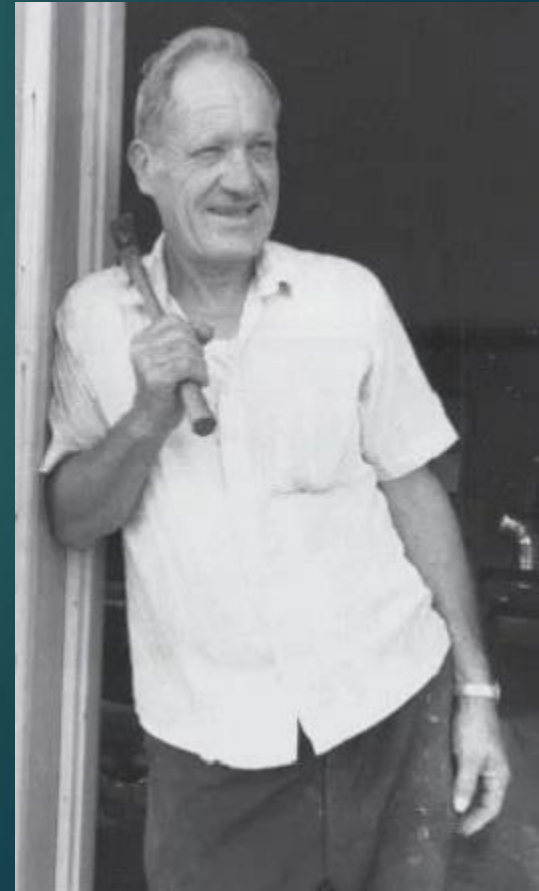

- Kentucky Department of Corrections and Dismas Charities have been in partnership for 56 years
- The partnership started with 15 residents in 1964
- Currently Dismas Charities operates 31 Bureau of Prisons Re-entry programs in 13 states.
- Dismas Charities operates 7 State facilities in Kentucky for the D.O.C.
- Dismas operates 3 licensed Substance Abuse Programs in the Commonwealth
- Dismas Charities operates a Federal Re-entry facility in Manchester KY.
- Dismas Charities has served over 110,000 federal and state residents since 2005
- Dismas Charities has served 24,454 residents in the Commonwealth

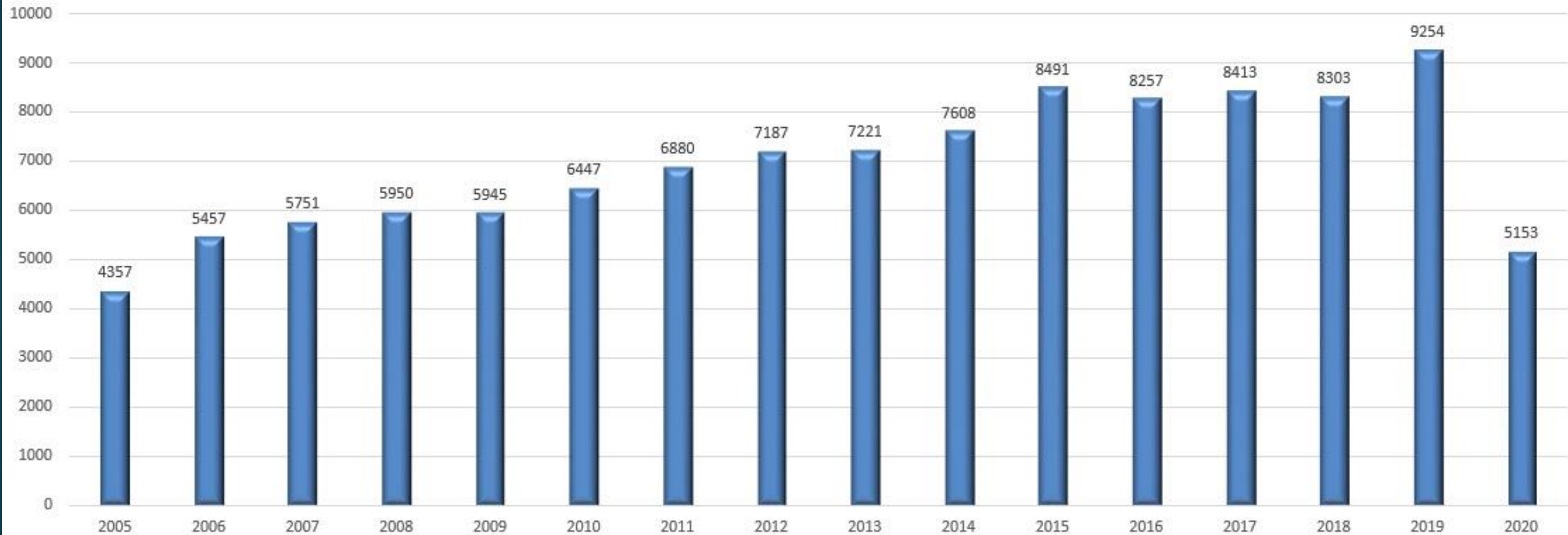


Accountability:

1. In 2005 Dismas Charities developed and implemented a proprietary Case Management System “FreshStart”.
2. In 2009 Dismas Charities developed and Implemented a Biometric Resident Accountability Module “R.A.M.”
3. R.A.M. identifies and records both residents and staff accountability via biometric Fingerprinting
4. Since 2009 over 14,000,000 biometric/accountability scans have been recorded in R.A.M.
5. Resident accountability module provides alerts to Dismas staff should a resident fail to return timely

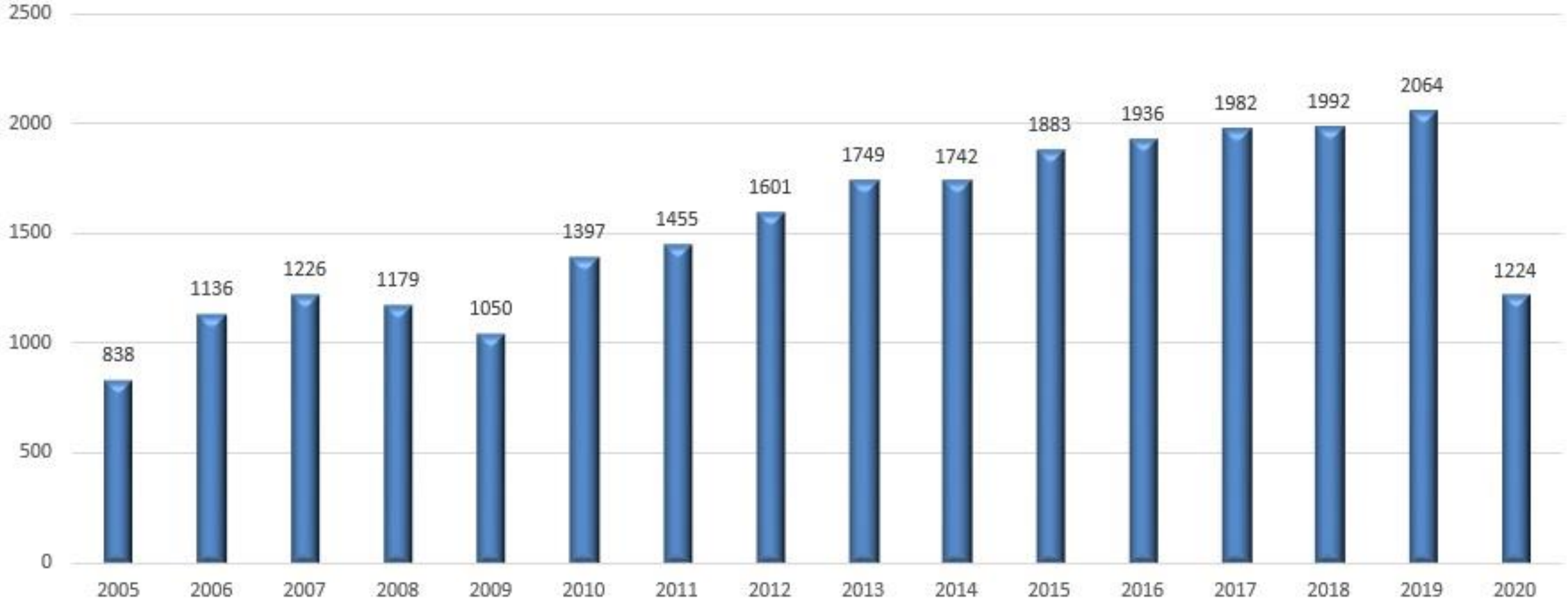

110,674 Total Residents Served

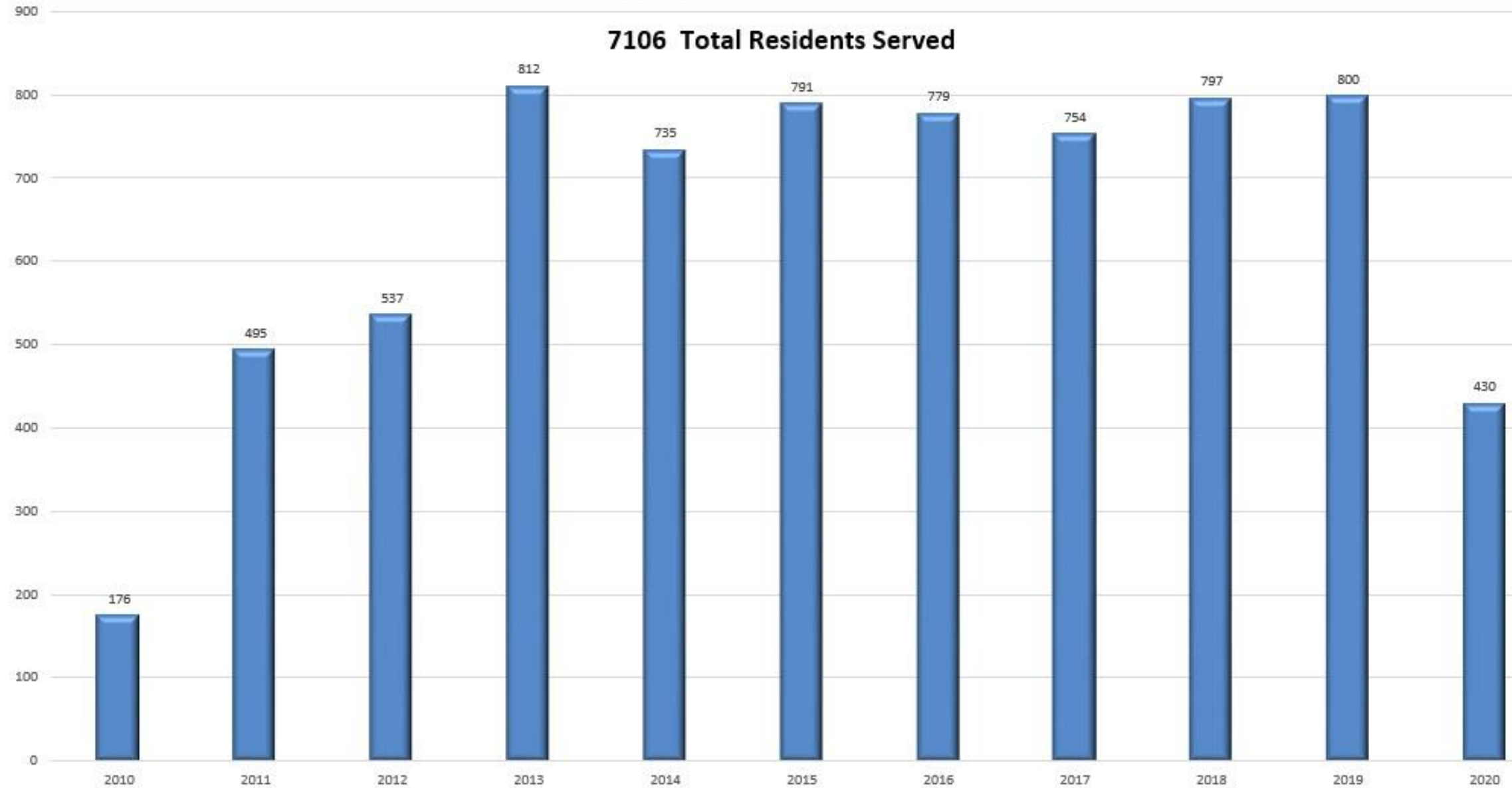

24,454 Total Residents Served

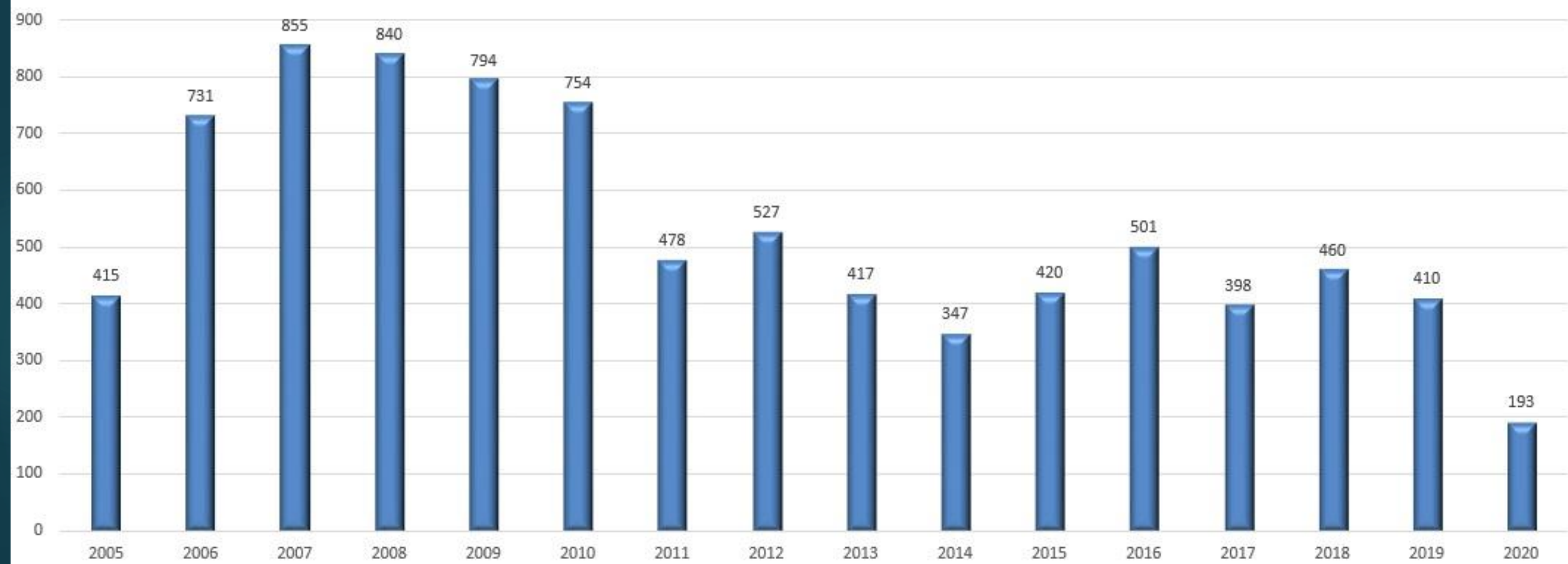

January 1, 2010-July 31, 2020



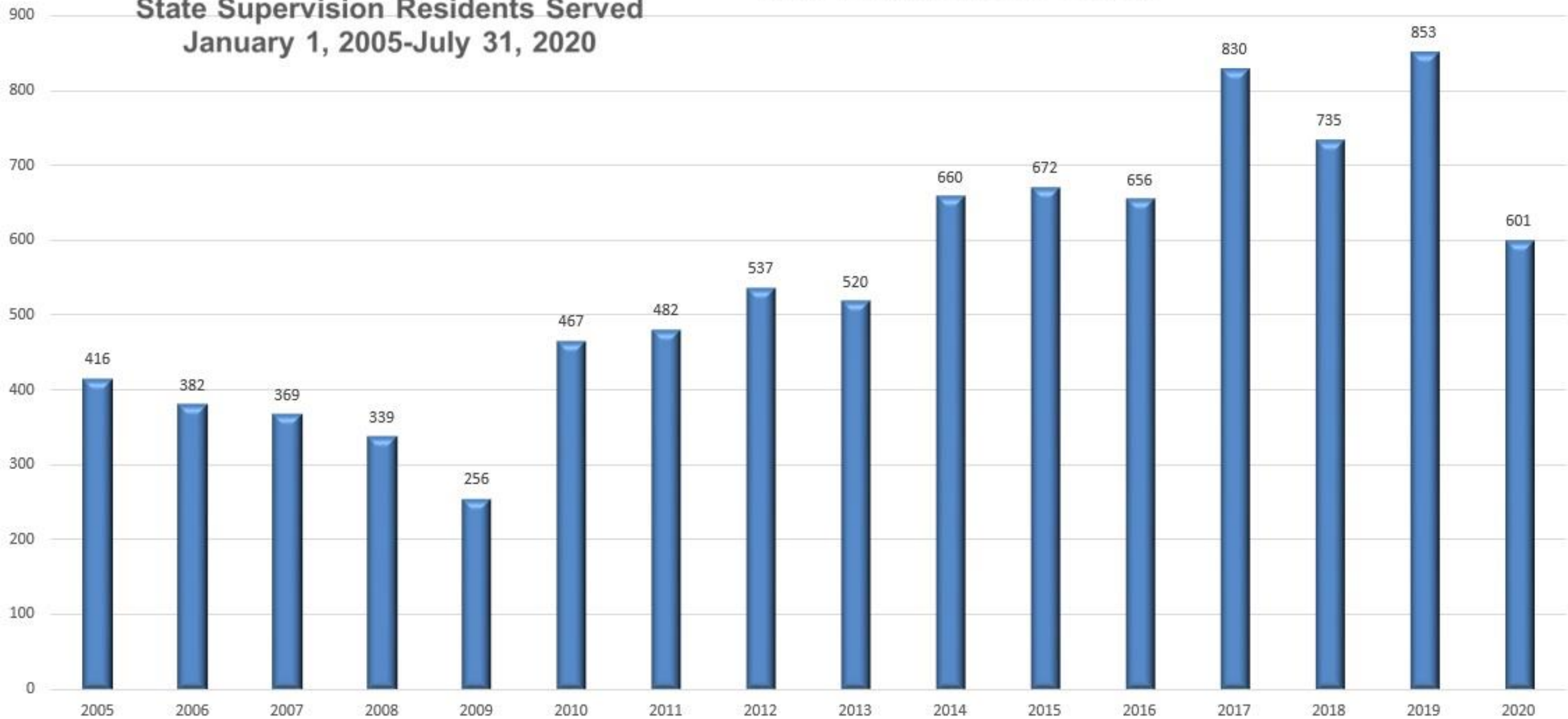

Research

Study Based On Association of State Correctional Administrators Formula for Recidivism Rates

- 2009 – 13.5%
- 2010 – 10.2%
- 2011 – 13.1%
- 2012 – 11.2%
- 2013 -- 9.7%
- 2014 – 14.5%

Kentucky Recidivism Definition: An individual's return to the custody of the department of corrections within two years of release from a state institution or contract facility, by parole, shock probation or completion of sentence.

Data driven outcomes serve to create transition which sets the stage for personal transformation for successful re-entry.
