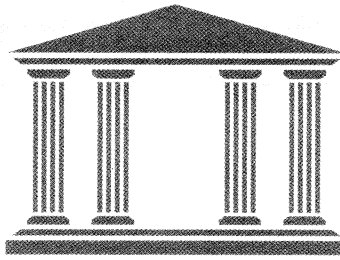

Dear Ms. Cubbage,

On January 27, 2021 I was approached by Mr. Randall Daniel, one of the four people who signed a petition to impeach Governor Beshear. I explained to Mr. Daniel that impeachment is not a proper response when public officials make policy decisions with which a citizen disagrees. Even if, as does not presently appear, the Governor has done something unconstitutional, that too is not grounds for impeachment. Elected officials and state employees can, and sometimes do, make good-faith errors as to the requirements of the Constitution. The remedy for that is rarely impeachment. At the bottom line, I told Mr. Daniel that I wish I could grant him some power to turn back time and to refuse to sign the pending petition.

Mr. Daniel emphatically agreed with me, and retained me for the sole purpose of removing himself as a party to the Petition. I realize that time is of the essence, and that it may even be too late to do much, but I told him I would try and assist him.

As soon as I can, I will be filing a motion for Mr. Daniel to withdraw as a party to the Petition. If you can find a moment to speak with me fairly soon, I would be very grateful.
