ABOUT THE KCAA

- All duly elected county attorneys in good standing are eligible for membership in the association.
 Assistant County Attorneys may be associate members.
- Frequently work with other affiliate agencies (i.e. KACo, Commonwealth Attorney's Association, Jailer's Association, Sheriff's Association, etc.) on legislation impacting criminal justice and county government.
- Employ an Executive Director to assist with membership needs
- Engage a contract lobbyist to help with legislation

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Overview of County Attorney Duties



Prosecution (PAC)

- State funding is 99% salary for prosecution staff only
- \$3,000 per year for expenses no additional funding allocated for rent, computers & IT services, office expenses

Child Support Contract with CHFS-DIS

- Pays expenses & salaries solely for child support collection.
- Reimbursement only system, administered by CHFS/DGA.
- Individual county budgets set annually by CHFS.

Bad Check Collection Programs (KRS 514.040)

- \$50 gross per check collected
- Operating expenses only; sharply declining
- Many offices receive < \$2,000 a year

Traffic Safety Diversion Programs (KRS 186.574)

- \$25 clerk fee for deputy clerk; \$30 fee paid finance cabinet for TBI fund, DPA, sheriff, etc.
- Funds office expenses such as IT, computer, etc. that exceed the \$3000 annual stipend; can also help fund personnel, i.e. victim advocate, assistant county attorney, etc.

Delinquent Tax Collection (KRS 134.504)

- CA receives a portion of penalty paid by taxpayer
- Used for operation of County Attorney office
- Declining

Local Governments

- Not statutorily required
- Some direct budget appropriations
- Many are in-kind only (courthouse office space, etc.)

Follow the *Funk V. Milliken* Standard



- 1. Necessary;
- 2. Reasonable;
- 3. Beneficial to the Public; and
- 4. Not predominately personal in nature

Operating Expenses

Actual & necessary incident to the TOTAL duties of the County Attorney Office

Can include both CIVIL & CRIMINAL duties

Allowable Operating Expenses

Salaries, Benefits and Retirement costs – both CIVIL and CRIMINAL (i.e. victim advocate, assistants)


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KRS 186.574 – Traffic Safety Statute



Authorizes a county attorney to operate a traffic safety program for traffic offenders



Prohibits Kentucky CDL license holders from participating



Authorizes the county attorney to charge a "reasonable fee"



Restricts the fee to "operating expenses"



Requires an annual report to PAC by October 1




Requires a set fee of \$25 fee for clerks and \$30 fee for other agencies



TRAFFIC SAFETY PROGRAMS

Citation Issued by Law Enforcement Officer

Option 1:

Pay citation in full.

Depending on the charge, points may apply against the driver's license.

Option 2:

Attend Court and
either plea, see if
the prosecutor will
dismiss or amend to
a no points violation, or ask for a
trial date.

Option 3:

If eligible, enroll in state traffic school.

Driver pleads guilty to the charge, but avoids points on his or her license.

Option 4:

If eligible, enroll in County Attorney
Traffic Safety program. Upon successful completion the citation is dismissed.

Who can participate?

Like with all prosecutions, the local prosecutor has discretion.

Typical charges referred to traffic safety

programs:

Speeding

Disregarding stop sign

Disregarding traffic control device – traffic light

Careless Driving Offenses

Improper Lane Usage

Failure to or Improper
Turn Signal




