For reference, the following are the definitions for the findings:

Substantiated – means the incident occurred by an admission of the person responsible or by the preponderance of the evidence.

Not Substantiated – means there is insufficient evidence to determine if the incident occurred or if the accused was involved in the incident.

Exonerated – means the incident occurred, but the accused actions were justified or proper.

Unfounded – means the charges are false or the employee was not involved in the incident.
