Mission: The mission of Family Scholar House is to end the cycle of poverty and transform our communities by empowering families and youth to succeed in education and achieve life-long self-sufficiency.



Residential Program: Family Scholar House has five residential campuses in Louisville with a total of 279 affordable apartments. 247 are for families with 32 reserved for young adults formerly in foster care. Additional campuses are in development, including one in Elizabethtown. All adult participants are required to be full-time in a post-secondary program ranging from credentialing to associate's degrees to four-year bachelor's degrees. Family Scholar House's goal is to help participants earn the education necessary for career-track employment and become fully independent from government subsidies.

Participants in the residential program receive comprehensive support and services in a two-generational program model to promote success for student parents and their children. Participants have FSH staff to help them, including academic, apprenticeship and career coaches; family advocates/social workers; health & wellness counselors; therapists; tutors; and mentors. They also have access to affordable housing, childcare, transportation, technology, food pantries, professional clothing, and emergency assistance.

Pre-residential and Non-residential Program: Participants in the pre-residential program receive all of the services provided for residents except housing and childcare while they wait for the opportunity to move onto a Family Scholar House campus. Non-residential participants identify as not needing housing but needing assistance from Family Scholar House to enter and advance in the careers of their choice.

Kentucky Outreach/Education: Workforce Solutions: With targeted outreach through community colleges, (KCTCS), other public and private colleges and universities and employers with apprenticeships and work-based learning program, Family Scholar House utilizes its Trager Response Center to help Kentuckians stay in school and in their jobs. Our staff are available Monday through Saturday, 12 hours per day to make outbound calls on behalf of the institutions and employers and take inbound calls from anyone needing support. Currently, the Response Center team is making taking over 1,000 calls per day.

Data Tracking and Analytics: For all programs, Family Scholar House is able to track over 150 fields of information for every household, including demographics, family data, trauma experienced, government benefits, workforce participation, wages, education and health of adults and children, self-sufficiency matrix scores, and every touchpoint with Family Scholar House. As a result, Family Scholar House can identify the cost to help each participant and the return on investment as they transition off of governments benefits.



MyKY.info: Family Scholar House developed this state-wide web-app to make it easier for those in need to find what they need quickly. All resources entered are free and use of the web-app is always free. In addition to accessing it in the browser of computers, phones, and notebooks/iPads, Family Scholar House is placing kiosks in high-traffic areas across the commonwealth.
