Key Statistics

- As of October 2022, Kentucky had approximately 1,100 certified minority-owned businesses.
- Minority residents make up 33.4% of Louisville's population.
- Yet, only 2.4% of businesses are Blackowned (Spectrum News 1).
- Louisville ranks last among major U.S. metros for minority-owned businesses per 1,000 minority residents (5.97 per 1,000).

Ongoing Support Initiatives

- Construction Diversity Accelerator (CDA)
- OneWest's "The Plan Room"

Recent Growth Trends and Successes

- CDA's 2024 cohort included 21 businesses, 18 minority-owned.
- OneWest's "The Plan Room" offers training and mentorship to Black and Brown business owners.
- Louisville Metro invested over \$13 million in FY 2022 to support minority businesses.

- Call for reinvestment by public and private partners
