The Enduring Value of HBCUs

• HBCUs enroll 10% of Black undergraduates, but award nearly 20% of degrees.

- Despite representing only 3% of college and university population in the U.S., HBCUs graduate 40% of all Black engineers, 50% of all Black teachers, 70% of all doctors and dentists and 80% of all Black judges*
- Serve as engines of innovation and upward mobility.


Unduplicated Enrollment Headcount
