

Overview of Kentucky Thoroughbred Breeding & Racing


The Kentucky Thoroughbred industry has a competitive advantage in 2021 thanks to favorable market conditions within our internal racing circuit.

Kentucky is a net exporter of Thoroughbred foals and yearlings to every racing state and over forty countries worldwide. Nationally, breeding has contracted in many states however our commercial bloodstock market and foal crop numbers have remained stable, bucking a national trend.

Outside of Derby week and Keeneland's spring and fall meets, the Kentucky circuit was historically a regional pursuit, with California and New York leading the nation in purses, Graded Stakes, i.e. most prestigious races, and field size.

Since 2012 and thanks to Historical Racing complimenting our live racing, Kentucky Thoroughbred racing has bucked national trends of contraction, with strong and steady growth in purses, Graded Stakes, and field size.




