WHAT ARE OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME PROGRAMS?

OST (out-of-school time) programs, offered before school, after school and during the summer, provide a supervised and safe space for youth that includes opportunities for them to learn, explore interests, and develop important life skills when school is not in session but parents are often still at work.

Programs often reinforce what students learn in school and provide extra support to students who are struggling or have special needs. They also provide more time for deeper learning, creative spaces for hands-on projects, and opportunities for students of all ages to explore careers.



Impact of Out-of-School Time Programs:

Decades of <u>research</u> proves that students who regularly participate in quality OST programming:



Gain self-control, confidence, and social skills



Make gains in reading and math



Explore career paths and gain workforce skills



Improve school attendance, work habits, and grades



Have higher graduation rates



Build healthy relationships with their peers and adults

80% of Kentucky parents with a child in an afterschool program agree that the program helps them keep their job or work more hours



85% of Kentucky parents agree that afterschool programs provide working parents peace of mind



94% of parents are satisfied with their child's experience in out-of-school time programs

Barriers to Access

Now more than ever, kids need the academic enrichment and creative learning opportunities that out-of-school-time programs offer.



37% of parents report no afterschool program available in their community



For every **ONE** student enrolled in an OST program, **FOUR** more are waiting to get in



46% have no safe way for their child to get to and from programs



56% of parents report that the programs are too expensive
