KY Physician Economic Impact

- 94,338+ Kentucky jobs supported by physicians
- \$1.9M average economic impact of each physician
- Decrease of 590 physicians = Over \$1B in economic impact lost

Physician Wellbeing

- Experiencing more stress now than before the pandemic, but it is manageable and does not affect their quality of life
- 23% Experiencing stress and having a difficult time managing and/or is impacting their professional satisfaction

Major Causes of Stress:

- **→** Too many administrative burdens at work (43%)
- Problems with work/personal life balance (30%)
- Not enough clinical support (27%)
- → Not enough administrative support (26%)



Prior Authorization

- 81% said prior authorization delays access to necessary care for patients sometimes (24%), often (43%), or always (14%)
- 61% cited prior authorization for medications as the main administrative burden.
 - 47% cited imaging
 - 30% cited procedures
- "Patient died of a hypoglycemic event and drowning while he was waiting on a PA for a continuous glucose sensor."



Solutions

- Reform prior authorization and help to reduce the number of administrative burdens put on physicians
- Continue to support physician wellness
- Maintain support for the Kentucky State Loan Repayment Program
- Invest in state-based graduate medical education
