
SB84 was passed in 2019

Regulations


- Regulations were implemented July 2020
- First licenses were issued August 2020
- Current proposed regulation change to lower the initial licensure and renewal fee from \$1,000 to \$500.00




Total number of clients served




Number of live births







Total newborn and maternal deaths




Number of referrals

Breastfeeding rate at 6 weeks




% Breastfeeding for at least 6 weeks

C-Section rate







Where LCPMs are Located






States that License Certified Professional Midwives


