

## **Kentucky Physician Shortage Facts**

## THE PROBLEM

Physician supply lags patient demand nationally and across Kentucky. As supply falls, patients wait longer to see a doctor, and doctors burn out.



The U.S. is projected to have 120,000 too few doctors nationally.

- ▶ Nearly 40% of American physicians will reach retirement age by 2030.¹
- ▶ By 2030, the United States will face a shortage of over 120,000 physicians.²
- ▶ 32.3% of Kentucky physicians are within retirement range right now.<sup>3</sup>

Kentucky ranks in the bottom half of all states for primary care doctor availability and overall physician supply.<sup>5</sup>

→ **40<sup>th</sup>** in total primary physicians

**44**<sup>th</sup> in active primary physicians



Kentucky is projected to be **short 2,926 doctors** by 2030.

▶ Primary care alone is projected to be **short 624 providers.**⁴

## 107 of Kentucky's 120 counties are health professional shortage areas (HPSAs).<sup>6</sup>

- ▶ Low-income citizens are disproportionately affected by these shortages.
- HPSA designations indicate areas where there are 3,500 or more patients for every one provider.



Kentucky's physician-to-patient ratio is
