25 Typologies of Human Trafficking

In 2017, Polaris analyzed data collected from the National Human Trafficking Hotline and released a report of the 25 primary types of human trafficking that exist in the US. Each type has a unique business model, trafficker & victim profile, recruitment strategies and control mechanisms that facilitate that particular type of trafficking.

From sex trafficking within escort services to labor trafficking of farmworkers, the ways humans are exploited differ greatly. Each type has unique strategies for recruiting and controlling victims, and concealing the crime.





NEW CRIMINAL CASES:

Federal prosecutors in Kentucky charged 4 new criminal human trafficking cases in 2019, ranking it 9th in the nation for number of new cases.



Sex Trafficking Forced Labor

Federal courts in Kentucky handled 7 active criminal human trafficking cases in 2019, ranking it 25th in the nation for number of active cases.

CONVICTIONS:


Federal courts in Kentucky convicted **2 defendants in human trafficking cases** in 2019, ranking it 35th in the nation for number of defendants convicted.










