Kentucky Medical Cannabis Program

• The Kentucky Medical Cannabis Program (KMCP) sits within the Cabinet for Health and Family Services and was established to implement the requirements established in Senate Bill 47 (KRS 218B) to govern the safe and effective use of medical cannabis in Kentucky.

• As of July 1, 2024, the Kentucky Medical Cannabis Program is overseen and implemented by the **Office of Medical Cannabis**.





Our Mission

Our mission is to ensure Kentuckians suffering from serious medical conditions have safe, affordable access to medical cannabis. As medical cannabis is a healthcare necessity for Kentuckians with cancer, multiple sclerosis, epilepsy, post-traumatic stress disorder, and other serious conditions, our program will prioritize patient safety, access, and affordability.

Update on Medical Cannabis Practitioners



Overview

Practitioner Authorization and Registration

KRS 218B.050(1) requires practitioners to apply with their state licensing boards to become authorized to provide written certifications for medical cannabis to qualified patients.

KRS 218B.050(6)(a) requires the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Office of Medical Cannabis to create and provide the written certification form to be used by medical cannabis practitioners when recommending use of medical cannabis for their qualified patients.

State Medical Licensure Boards

Cabinet for Health and Family Services,

Responsible for **authorizing** practitioners to become registered to provide written certifications for medical cannabis

Responsible for **registering** authorized practitioners and providing **access to the written certification** form



About Authorized Medical Cannabis Practitioners

Types of Practitioners and Authorizing Licensing Boards

A medical cannabis practitioner, as defined by KRS 218B.010(17), "means a physician or an advanced practice registered nurse who is authorized to prescribe controlled substances under KRS 314.042, who is authorized by his or her state licensing board to provide written certifications pursuant to KRS 218B.050."

Physicians



A physician licensed by the Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure ("KBML") with the ability to prescribe controlled substances

APRNs



An advanced practice registered nurse ("APRN") licensed by the Kentucky Board of Nursing ("KBN") with the ability to prescribe controlled substances



Medical Cannabis Practitioner Authorization

Practitioners must become authorized by a state licensing board and register with the Cabinet's Office of Medical Cannabis to provide written certifications for medical cannabis.

Steps for completing the practitioner authorization process:





Apply to your licensing board and become an
authorized medical
cannabis practitioner

Step 2



Register for an account to access the online Medical Cannabis Practitioner Registry

Step 3



Provide qualified patients written certifications using
the registry portal on or
after December 1, 2024

Update on Medical Cannabis Business Licensing



Business Operations and Licensing Regulatory Highlights

The regulations regarding cannabis <u>businesses</u> establish how cultivators, processors, producers, safety compliance facilities, and dispensaries will apply, become licensed, and operate in the Commonwealth. <u>See 915 KAR Chapter 1.</u>







Business Operations and Licensing Regulatory Highlights

Business Operations and Licensing Regulatory Highlights



On April 18, 2024, the Program filed 2 emergency regulations with accompanying identical ordinary regulations. These regulations provide how proposed cannabis businesses can apply to become licensed in the Commonwealth and the requirements following licensure.

Business Regulations License Types



Responsible for planting, raising, harvesting, trimming, and curing medical cannabis




Responsible for processing and packaging raw plant material into usable product formats

Responsible for contamination and purity testing of raw plant material and products



Responsible for purchasing and selling finished products to cardholders



Business Regulations Safety and Security Requirements

Testing



All harvest and production batches are subject to testing for THC and cannabinoid concentrations and toxins.

Recalls



Cannabis businesses
may initiate
voluntary or
mandatory recalls
based on complaints
or risks to public
safety and health.

Age Restrictions



All patients under 18 are required to have a registered caregiver, and no product packaging can appeal to minors.

Surveillance and Alarms



Professionally monitored surveillance and alarm systems must be used to prevent unauthorized access.

Physical
Security and
Lighting



All entrances and exits to and from the facility must be locked during non-working hours with proper lighting used at all times.

Business Regulations Dispensary Regions





Dispensary licenses will be issued in eleven (11) regions.

Business Regulations Dispensary Regions and Licensing

- Each dispensary region will receive four (4) dispensary licenses.
- Region 1 (Bluegrass) and Region 2 (Kentuckiana) will receive an additional two (2) licenses for Fayette and Jefferson counties.
- Applicants may only apply for one (1) dispensary license per region.


