Executive Order 2025-335 (May 29, 2025)

On May 29, 2025, Governor Beshear issued Executive Order 2025-355, allowing any individual who was approved by the Office to Receive a medical cannabis card in calendar year 2025 to have their \$25 renewal application fee waived in calendar year 2026.

Across the Commonwealth, our citizens suffer from a multitude of serious medical conditions from which they deserve relief.

The Governor signed Senate Bill 47 ("SB 47") on March 31, 2023, which became effective in the Commonwealth of Kentucky on June 29, 2023. Pursuant to SB 47, on January 1, 2025, it became lawful for Kentuckians to use medical cannabis if done in accordance with KRS Chapter 218B and any administrative regulations promulgated under those statutes.

As of May 29, 2025, the Kentucky Office of Medical Cannabis has licensed 81 medical cannabis businesses across all license types and issued more than 10,000 cards to registered qualified patients and designated caregivers in the Commonwealth.

As licensed medical cannabis businesses continue to take all necessary steps to become operational in Kentucky with substantial support from the Office of Medical Cannabis, I remain committed to providing relief to Kentuckians suffering from serious medical conditions as well as ensuring they have safe, affordable access to medical cannabis under the new program. I am also committed to ensuring those individuals who received their medical cannabis cards during the program's inaugural year do not incur renewal application fees without experiencing the full benefit of their cards and the program.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kentucky Constitution and KRS 12.029, do hereby Declare, Order and Direct the following:

- I. For any individual who was approved by the Office of Medical Cannabis to receive a medical cannabis card in calendar year 2025, the Office of Medical Cannabis shall waive the \$25 renewal application fee established in 915 KAR 2:010, Section 4 if the cardholder properly applies and is approved for a renewal of his or her medical cannabis card in calendar year 2026.
- All other provisions and requirements contained in 915 KAR 2:010 remain in full force and effect.

This Order shall be effective May 29, 2025.



Licensee Requirements

Medical cannabis businesses must meet certain requirements to receive a license and legally operate in the Commonwealth.

Licensees must establish standard operating procedures to comply with all applicable regulations

Facility Requirements



Facilities shall meet all applicable state and local business codes in addition to the requirements in the regulations

Recordkeeping



Requirements for proper organization and storing of all relevant documentation



Facility Requirements

- Licensees must follow state guidelines and local building codes and specifications, and must also meet facility standards in the applicable licensee regulations, which include the following:
 - Pest control;
 - Lighting;
 - Parking;
 - Secure areas for loading and unloading medical cannabis; and
 - Proper signage designating all limited-access areas on the premises.



Security and Surveillance



Security and Surveillance

Medical cannabis businesses must meet certain physical security and surveillance requirements to limit access to medical cannabis products, raw plant material, and other supplies.

Product Safety



Product Safety

Cannabis business licensees are required to produce, process, and sell medicinal cannabis products that meet stringent safety and quality standards.

Contamination Prevention



Prevent contamination through documented sanitizing, cleaning, storing and disposing procedures Use of Pesticides and Chemicals



Follow state and federal rules around the use of pesticides and chemicals in cultivation, processing, and production

Allowable Product Formats



Produce medicinal cannabis products in allowable formats and prohibit consumption of raw plant material by smoking

Testing



Follow prescribed testing procedures including reporting and disposals

Recalls



Initiate voluntary and mandatory recalls based on complaints or risks to public safety



Allowable Product Formats

Medicinal cannabis may only be processed and sold in the following allowable product forms:

- Edible
- Oil
- Vaporization
- Tincture
- Dermal patch

- Suppository
- Beverage
- Raw plant material
- Topical (gel, cream, ointment, etc.)

KRS 218B prohibits the consumption of raw plant material by smoking.

Dispensary Product Displays

- A dispensary may display product examples for the purpose of product education. A sign or label must be displayed on or near the product example that clearly states: "PRODUCT EXAMPLE FOR DISPLAY PURPOSES ONLY. NOT FOR SALE OR CONSUMPTION."
- The product example must be packaged in a secure jar protected by plastic, glass, or metal mesh screen to allow cardholders to view the product.
- The product example must be recorded in the seed-to-sale tracking system and shall be destroyed once the product is noticeably degraded.



Advertising and Patient Materials



Advertising and Patient Materials

Advertising activities are strictly regulated. Dispensaries are required to provide patients and caregivers with certain educational materials and product information.

Advertising Restrictions

Prohibited advertising practices that licensees must refrain from when retaining or obtaining new business

Labeling requirements

Rules and product guidelines that will be displayed on product labeling to protect consumers **Educational** materials

Advertising Restrictions: Targeting Minors

Licensees are prohibited from creating and publishing advertising content that can reasonably be considered to target individuals under the age of eighteen.

Advertising that incorporates images of minors, cartoons, toys, or similar images and items typically marketed towards minors, or references to products that are commonly associated with minors or marketed by minors are strictly prohibited.

Additional precautions must also be taken to prevent minor access including:

- Informational websites or social media must conspicuously state "keep out of reach of children;" and
- Instituting measures and safeguards on websites to deter access to those under eighteen years of age.



Labeling Requirements

All medical cannabis products must be labeled in a manner that properly informs cardholders, by labels and/or QR codes, and others of the contents of the product, including:

- Strain of medical cannabis
- THC, terpenes, and CBD
- List of ingredients
- Possible allergens
- Expiration Date
- Date of packaging

- The name and license number of the cannabis businesses involved in producing the product
- Production, batch, and testing information

All medical cannabis products must display the following warning label:





Educational Materials Medical Cannabis Advisory Pamphlet

- The Medical Cannabis Advisory Pamphlet was created in accordance with KRS 218B.140(2)(b).
- Dispensaries licensed by the Office are required by KRS
 218B.110(2)(d)(1)(a) to provide cardholders with a copy of the Medical
 Cannabis Advisory Pamphlet upon dispensing medical cannabis to the
 cardholders.

• Dispensaries must retain a signature form with the cardholder's signature for a minimum of thirty-six (36) months as required by KRS 218B.140(2)(b).
