Funding for Childcare

- Extend ARPA funding until the next funding cycle.
 - Some KY centers will lose up to \$25,000 per month without sustained funding forcing us to close many childcare centers.
 - Increased staff wages have far exceeded the pace of childcare fees.
 - Centers that can keep pace with increased rates will be forced to serve only those that can pay the higher rates. One of our centers would need to increase rates by 67% to break even.
- Add another round of non-profit assistance grants to be used for youth programming.
- Increase CCAP reimbursement rates.
- Make licensing requirements more efficient and consistent
- Strengthen Child Care Assistance Program Funding including expansion of available high- quality preschool, afterschool, and summer learning options for low-income families.
- Increase funding for out-of-school time programs aimed at closing the achievement gap.

Eliminate Sales Tax for Non-Profits

- Exempt non-profits
 - Remove taxation of all youth programming (sports, afterschool programming, summer camp, swim lessons).
- We provide over \$7 million a year in financial assistance and subsidies for children, families and seniors to participate in YMCA programs and membership
- With a state that suffers from horrible health outcomes, we all need to work together to reduce the health outcomes in KY.
- Drowning is a leading cause of death in children. We need to do everything we can to eliminate barriers to prevent drowning.

MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS

Serving people of all incomes, ages and abilities

- Kentucky's YMCAs serve nearly 400,000 people in diverse communities around the state. We bring together young and old, women and men, people of all faiths, backgrounds and incomes. YMCA scholarships, subsidies and outreach provide critical access to low-income families.
- The Y welcomes everyone! We provide activities for everyone, including afterschool programming, swim lessons, free health fairs/screenings, physical activity programs, nutrition advice, cancer recovery programming and more.



Serving vulnerable populations in our communities

- Children: Our Kentucky YMCA's serve over 160,000 children and youth.
 The Y provides a wide range of activities to foster healthy, productive children, including teen clubs, sports leagues, family nights, and community service projects. All youth activities incorporate the YMCA Core Values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility.
- Older Americans: Nearly 50,000 seniors, those over 65 years of age, participate in specialized fitness programs, social activities, and events provided by the Y, making them one of the fastest growing segments of our membership. The Y is committed to helping seniors across Kentucky continue to live full, healthy and independent lives.



Mobilizing community resources to meet community needs

- **Locally Driven:** YMCAs are created by the local community based on a regional needs assessment and are controlled by a local board of community volunteers.
- **Contributed Income:** Kentucky YMCAs receive over **\$6 million a year** in support from annual community contributions.
- **Volunteer Hours:** Our YMCAs mobilize over **8,000 volunteers each year** to serve their local communities.
- **Key Partnerships:** Recognizing the importance of collaborations, Kentucky YMCAs create partnerships with a wide-range of organizations in the communities they serve.
