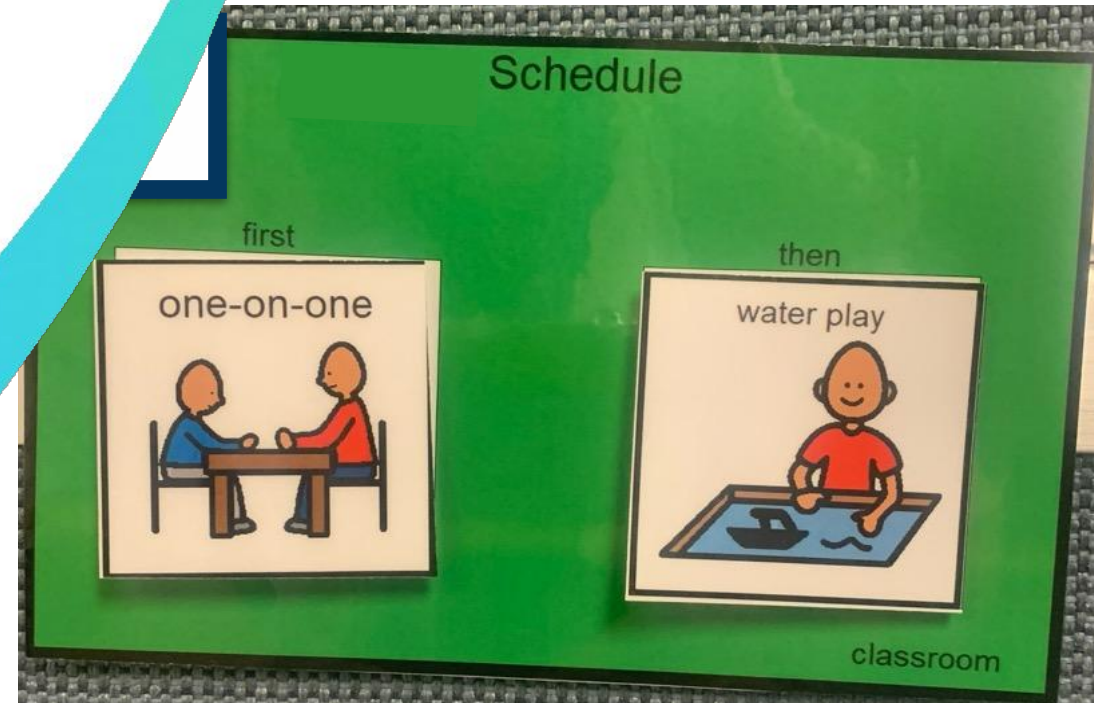
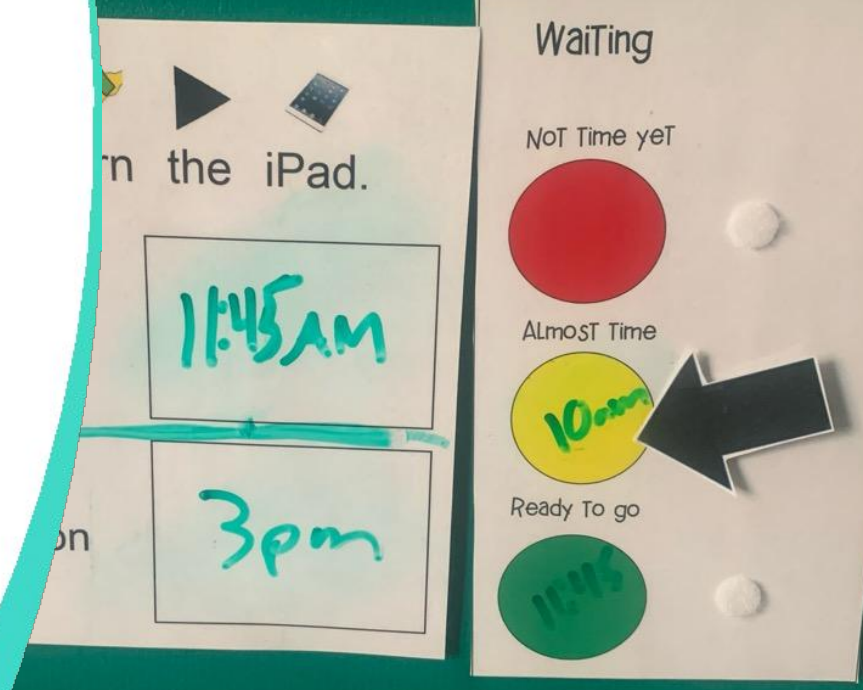


Behavioral and Psychiatric Care

Students receive individualized behavioral plans to achieve a safer and more independent life.

Our Behavior and Psychiatric Team Includes:

- 1** School Psychologist
- 3** Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBA)
- 4** Certified Autism Specialists
- 2** Registered Behavior Technicians



Speech-Language and Occupational Therapies

Students receive speech-language and occupational therapies to overcome communication barriers and gain independence in the areas of daily living and self care.

Our Speech-Language and Occupational Therapies Teams Includes:

- 4** Speech-Language Pathologists (SLP)
- 2** Occupational Therapists (OT)
- 2** Speech-Language Pathologist Assistants
- 1** Occupational Therapy Assistant (COTA)





Medical Services

Students' health is treated as a top priority, receiving active care and medication management from a team of medical professionals.

Medication Management

On call availability 24-hours

(including office visits,

take place on campus.**

Adapted Extracurricular Activities

Art

- Minimum of 30 minutes per week
- Frequent campus-wide art projects and activities

Adapted Physical Education (APE)

- 90 minutes per week
- Focuses on building lifelong leisure skills and getting students active and moving

Music

- 90 minutes per week
- Focuses on music appreciation and engagement through the lens of group music therapy
