
Film Industry Statistics (US)

History of Film Incentives



2009 Legislative Session: Incentives created

- · 20%
- Refundable
- No Cap

2015 Legislative Session: Incentives enhanced

- 30-35%
- Refundable
- No Cap


2018 Legislative Session: Incentives capped

- 30-35%
- Non-Refundable / Non-Transferable
- Capped Incentive awards at \$100M per year



KY's Film Incentive

- 30-35% Non-Refundable, Non-Transferable Tax Credit
- 35% for filming in an Enhanced Incentive County


Movies and projects filmed in Kentucky since 2016

Supported 228 direct jobs


Investment by the Industry 2016-present (4 years)

Supporting 1,053 direct jobs


Direct Spend 2009-2019






