Restorative Justice

Restorative Justice (RJ) provides a holistic and comprehensive approach to the traditional criminal justice system by bringing together the offender, victim, and community to make things right.





Restorative Justice

The traditional systems ask what laws or rules have been broken and what punishment is deserved by the offender.

Restorative Justice asks what harm has been done, who is responsible for repairing that harm, and how can that harm be repaired?





Our Model In Criminal Justice Settings

Through facilitated conferences, parties collectively identify the harm, the impact of that harm, and determine a solution-based resolution.

The restorative justice approach ensures that restitution, whether monetary or symbolic, and compassion are integral parts of the judicial process.





Our Model in School Settings

Restorative practices in schools are designed to:

- promote a sense of belonging and strong relationships;
- identify conflict as an opportunity to improve and strengthen relationships; and
- develop accountability, cooperation, and problem-solving skills using restorative language, restorative circles, and restorative conferences.

74% Juvenile Justice System Referrals



Our Service Areas






Recent Updates

- Expansion of project with Jefferson County Public Schools
- Expansion of contract with KY Department of Juvenile Justice



Alternative to Detention program (ATD)

- Youth in the ATD continuum remaining in the home of their parent(s) or guardian(s) either on home supervision or an electronic monitor.
- Youth who are stepping down from other ATD or secure detention placements.
- Probated youth with pending probation revocation processes.



DJJ Contract Updates

- Jefferson County serving probated or committed in community placement
- We now have a two-year \$3 million contract
- Working with Department for Juvenile Justice to expand ATD services in more counties
