
Dual Credit Coursework Over Time




WKDC Recipients By the Numbers








WKDC Recipient Characteristics for all HS Graduating Class






Take	aways	
	• Work Ready Dual Credit recipients increased steadily from 2019 to 2022.	-
	• Those who received <i>only</i> WKDC awards had different outcomes than those that received both WKDC and DCS or DCS alone.	
	• Credit hours received and associate degrees earned in high school had lower rates than each of the four other groups.	
	 College-going rates were similar to all high school students and less than those that received DCS. 2nd year persistence in postsecondary was lower than all other groups. 	
	• Employment rates for WKDC recipients not enrolled in postsecondary were higher overall.	
	• Wages one year after graduation for WKDC recipients not enrolled in postsecondary were larger than DCS recipients overall and all high school students.	KYSTATS

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
