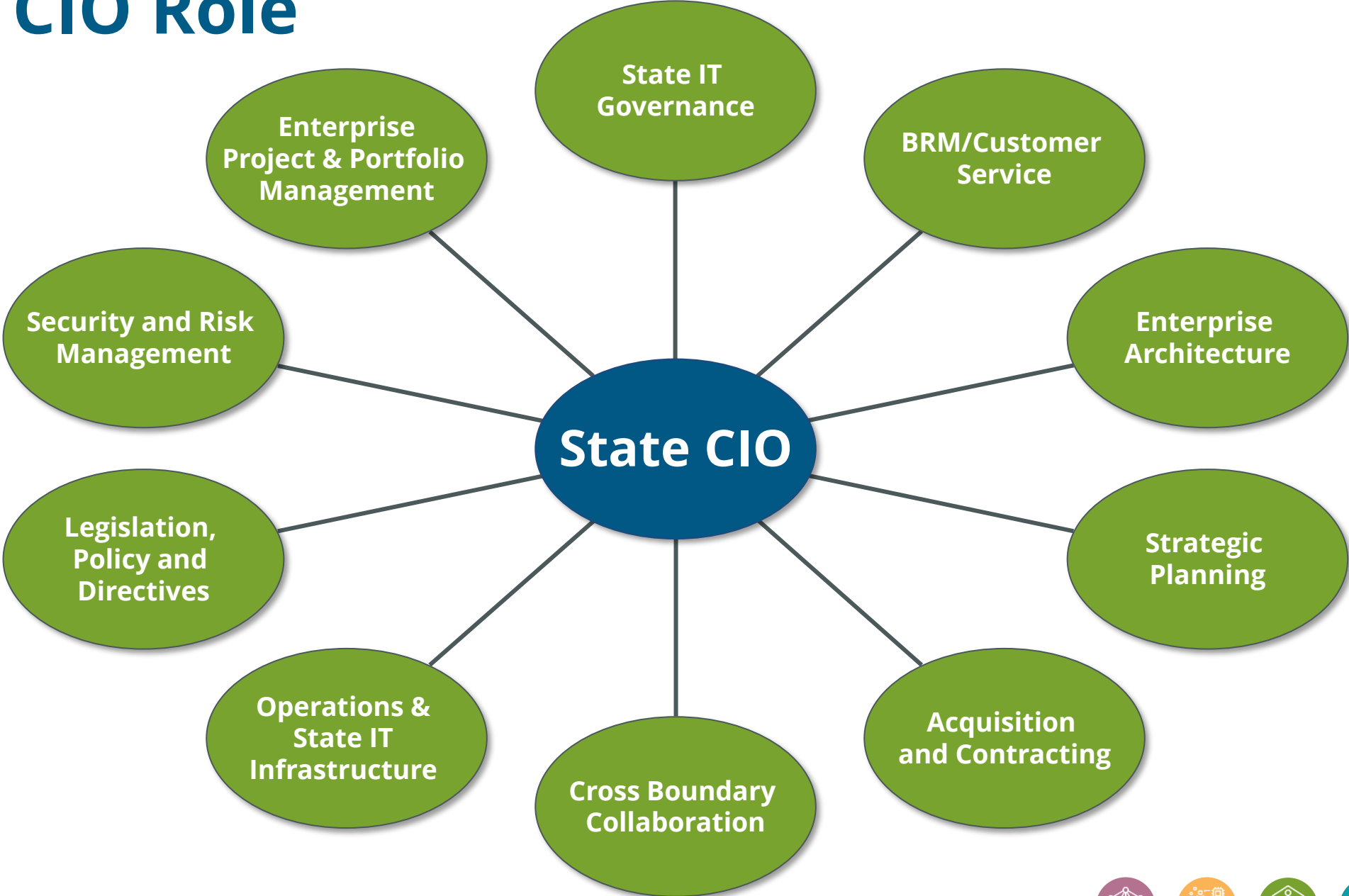

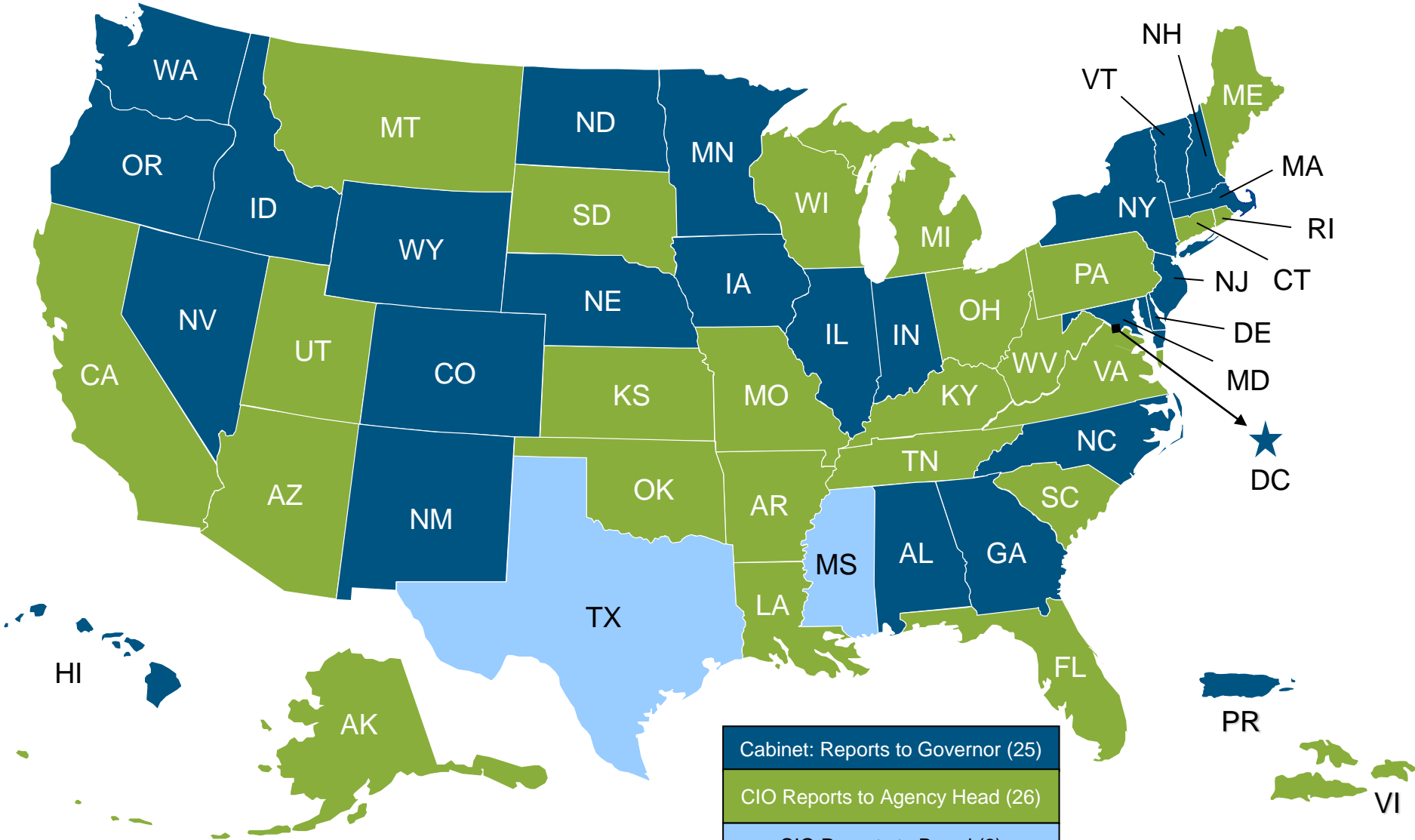
How are States Organized for IT?

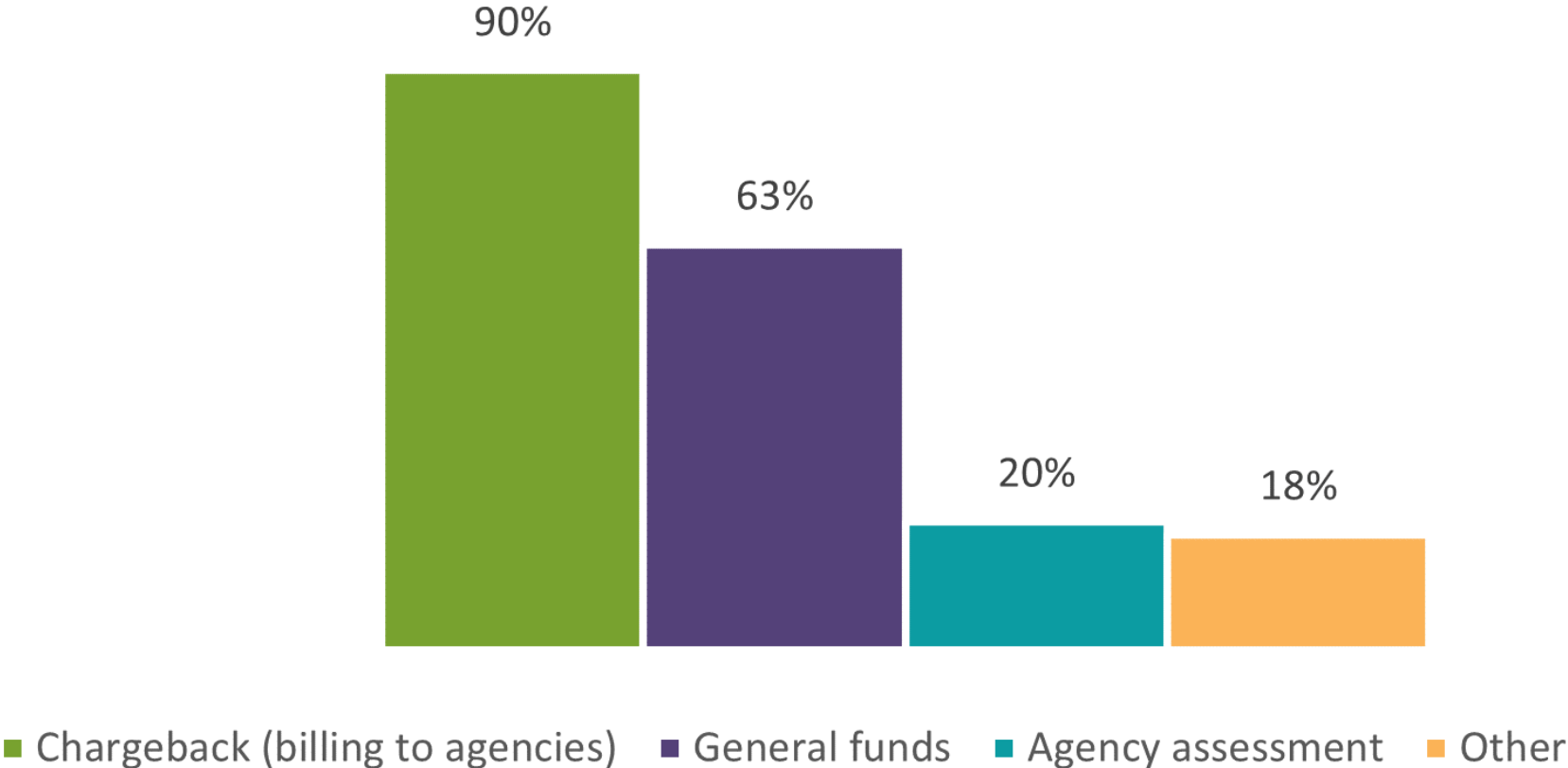

What's Trending?

Focus on digital services and transformation: improved **citizen experience**, citizen-centric design, streamlining services, automation, citizen **identity management**

Elevated cyber threats, nation state and criminal attacks; focus on **whole-of-state** cybersecurity resilience. Concerned about ransomware, human error, shadow IT, phishing and fraud.

Growing **cloud and SaaS adoption**; reducing IT diversity and complexity - seeking to “rationalize” the technology environment: hardware, software and services

Broader adoption of business **process automation**, chat bots and low code/no code solutions. Promise of Generative AI for the public sector?

Changing IT workforce: **remote/hybrid** environment, skills transformation, eliminating 4-year degree requirement
