


Of 2019-20 first-time kindergarteners, **36% of JCPS and 40% of the rest of the state attended public preschool** in the prior year.




A lower percentage of students who **did not attend public preschool** in JCPS were kindergarten ready in Fall 2019 (**48.3**%) than the balance of the state (**51.2**%).




A greater percentage of **public preschool attendees** in JCPS were kindergarten ready in Fall 2019 (**58.2**%) than the balance of the state (**50.3**%).


In Spring 2023, 37.8% of JCPS first-time Fall 2019 Kindergarteners were **proficient in 3rd grade Reading**. 42.3% of the balance of the state were proficient in Reading.




Among those **kindergarten ready**, JCPS students had a **3**rd **grade Reading proficiency** rate of 51.4% versus 59.3% for the balance of the state.




For those **not kindergarten ready**, the Reading proficiency rates were closer. (23.2% vs 24.4%)






32.6% of JCPS first-time Kindergarteners were proficient in 3rd grade Math while 39.4% of the balance of the state were proficient in 3rd grade Math.




Among those **kindergarten ready**, JCPS students had a 3rd grade Math proficiency rate of 46.9% versus 57.8% for the balance of the state.



For those **not kindergarten ready**, the Math proficiency rates were much lower, 17.2% in JCPS and 20.1% for balance of the state.




College-going rate among graduates from JCPS overall were lower than the balance of the state since 2015.
























Employment after Graduation









Life Outcomes for 2016 Graduates Highest Credential Attained by 2023











