

- Ensure technical training is available for emergency managers





Kentucky Emergency Management Agency Challenges:

- Conclusion of CSEPP in 2023, creating a \$1.5 million annual budget deficit for KYEM
- Declining staffing level due to:
 - Cost Non Merit Positions Private Sector
- Increasing number and severity of disasters
- State management of future disaster declarations
- Numerous counties with part time or no emergency director; challenge of some counties to provide adequate local response to severe incidents and disaster events
- Increased incidents of waste, fraud, abuse of federal awards by subrecipients
